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## AN ACT

RELATING TO HIGHER EDUCATION; DEFINING "FULL TIME" FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES FOR PURPOSES OF THE LEGISLATIVE LOTTERY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 21-1-4.3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1996, Chapter 71, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:

"21-1-4.3. LEGISLATIVE LOTTERY SCHOLARSHIPS AUTHORIZED--CERTAIN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS.--

A. To the extent that funds are made available by the legislature from the lottery tuition fund, the boards of regents of New Mexico state university, New Mexico institute of mining and technology, eastern New Mexico university, western New Mexico university, the university of New Mexico, New Mexico highlands university and northern New Mexico college shall award legislative lottery scholarships for qualified resident students attending their respective institutions and branches of those institutions.

B. Except as otherwise authorized in this section,
the legislative lottery scholarships authorized in this
section shall apply only to full-time resident students who,
immediately upon completion of a high school curriculum at a
public or accredited private New Mexico high school or upon
receiving a graduate equivalent diploma, are accepted for

SB 689 Page 1 1 entrance to and attend one of the state educational 2 institutions set forth in this section or one of the branches 3 of those institutions. Each legislative lottery scholarship shall be awarded for up to four consecutive years beginning 4 5 the second semester of the recipient's first year of 6 enrollment if the recipient has maintained residency in New Mexico and maintained a grade point average of 2.5 or higher 7 on a 4.0 scale during the first semester of full-time 8 enrollment. 9

C. The legislative lottery scholarships authorized 10 in this section shall also apply to full-time resident 11 students who, immediately upon completion of a high school 12 curriculum at a public or accredited private New Mexico high 13 school or upon receiving a graduate equivalent diploma, 14 15 attend a two-year public post-secondary educational institution in New Mexico and who, upon the completion of 16 that curriculum or at the end of two years, whichever is 17 sooner, transfer to one of the post-secondary state 18 educational institutions set forth in this section. 19 Those 20 students shall be eligible for a legislative lottery scholarship for two consecutive years if they maintain 21 residency in New Mexico, maintain a grade point average of 22 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale and attend the institution full 23 time during the regular academic year. 24

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D. The legislative lottery scholarships authorized SB 689 Page 2 in this section shall also apply to full-time resident students who:

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(1) within one hundred twenty days of completion of a high school curriculum at a public or accredited private New Mexico high school, or of receiving a graduate equivalent diploma, begin service in the United States armed forces; and

(2) within one hundred twenty days of completion of honorable service or medical discharge from the service are accepted for entrance to and attend one of the state educational institutions set forth in this section.

E. The higher education department shall prepare
guidelines setting forth explicit student continuing
eligibility criteria and guidelines for administration of the
legislative lottery scholarship program. Guidelines shall be
distributed to the board of regents of each institution to
enable a uniform availability of the resident student
legislative lottery scholarships.

F. For purposes of the legislative lottery
scholarship program as it applies to students with
disabilities who may require special accommodations, the
higher education department, in consultation with the student
and the office at the institution that serves students with
disabilities, shall review both the definition of "full time"
and the maximum number of consecutive semesters of SB 689

eligibility and adjust either or both as deemed reasonable and appropriate, based on the student's disability needs. In no case, however, shall "full time" mean fewer than six credit hours per semester and in no case shall eligibility extend beyond fourteen consecutive semesters."

Section 2. Section 21-13-10 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1963, Chapter 17, Section 9, as amended) is amended to read:

"21-13-10. BOARD DUTIES.--

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It is the duty of the community college board 9 Α. 10 to determine financial and educational policies of the community college. The community college board shall provide 11 for the management of the community college and execution of 12 these policies by selecting a competent president for the 13 community college, and, upon the president's recommendation, 14 15 the board shall employ other administrative personnel, instructional staff or other personnel as may be needed for 16 the operation, maintenance and administration of the 17 community college. 18

B. The community college board shall have the
power to fix tuition and fee rates for resident and
nonresident students of the community college district, to
accept gifts, to accept federal aid, to purchase, hold, sell
and rent property and equipment and to promote the general
welfare of the institution for the best interest of
educational service to the people of the community college S

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C. To the extent that funds are made available by the legislature from the lottery tuition fund, the community college board shall award legislative lottery scholarships for qualified resident students attending their respective institutions.

The legislative lottery scholarships authorized 7 D. 8 in this section shall apply only to full-time resident 9 students who, immediately upon completion of a high school 10 curriculum at a public or accredited private New Mexico high school or upon receiving a graduate equivalent diploma, are 11 accepted for entrance to and attend a community college. 12 Each legislative lottery scholarship shall be awarded for up 13 to two consecutive years beginning the second semester of the 14 15 recipient's first year of enrollment, provided that the recipient has maintained residency in New Mexico and 16 maintained a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 17 scale during the first semester of full-time enrollment. 18

E. The higher education department shall prepare
guidelines setting forth explicit student continuing
eligibility criteria and guidelines for administration of the
legislative lottery scholarship program. Guidelines shall be
distributed to community college boards to enable a uniform
availability of the resident student lottery tuition
scholarships.

For purposes of the legislative lottery scholarship program as it applies to students with disabilities who may require special accommodations, the higher education department, in consultation with the student and the office at the community college that serves students with disabilities, shall review both the definition of "full time" and the maximum number of consecutive semesters of eligibility and adjust either or both as deemed reasonable and appropriate, based on the student's disability needs. In no case, however, shall "full time" mean fewer than six credit hours per semester and in no case shall eligibility extend beyond fourteen consecutive semesters."

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Section 3. Section 21-16-10.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1996, Chapter 71, Section 6, as amended) is amended to read:

"21-16-10.1. LEGISLATIVE LOTTERY SCHOLARSHIPS AUTHORIZED.--

A. To the extent that funds are made available by the legislature from the lottery tuition fund, the board of a technical and vocational institute shall award legislative lottery scholarships for qualified resident students attending a technical and vocational institute.

B. The legislative lottery scholarships authorized
in this section shall apply only to full-time resident
students who, immediately upon completion of a high school
curriculum at a public or accredited private New Mexico high SB 689

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school or upon receiving a graduate equivalent diploma, are accepted for entrance to and attend a technical and vocational institute. Each legislative lottery scholarship shall be awarded for up to two consecutive years beginning the second semester of the recipient's first year of enrollment, provided that the recipient has maintained residency in New Mexico and maintained a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale during the first semester of full-time enrollment with renewal of an additional two years upon transfer.

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C. The higher education department shall prepare guidelines setting forth explicit student continuing eligibility criteria and guidelines for administration of the legislative lottery scholarship program. Guidelines shall be distributed to the boards of technical and vocational institutes to enable a uniform availability of the resident student legislative lottery scholarships.

For purposes of the legislative lottery D. 18 scholarship program as it applies to students with 19 20 disabilities who may require special accommodations, the higher education department, in consultation with the student 21 and the office at the technical and vocational institute that 22 serves students with disabilities, shall review both the 23 definition of "full time" and the maximum number of 24 25 consecutive semesters of eligibility and adjust either or SB 689
