7	Section 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the

10	A. "family" means a spouse and dependent children;	
11	B. "gift" means any donation or transfer without	
12	commensurate consideration of money, property, service, loan,

16	(1) any activity, including but not limited	
17	to the acceptance of a donation, transfer or contribution, or

22	make it clear that the gift is motivated by a family

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1 compensation for services rendered or (3) 2 capital invested that is: 3 normal and reasonable in amount; (a) commensurate with the value of the 4 (b) 5 service rendered or the magnitude of the risk taken on the 6 investment; in no way increased or enhanced by 7 (c) reason of the recipient's position as a state officer or 8 employee or candidate for state office; and 9 10 (d) not otherwise prohibited by law; (4) payment for a sale or lease of tangible 11 or intangible property that is commensurate with the value of 12 the services rendered and is in no way increased or enhanced 13 by reason of the recipient's position as a state officer or 14 15 employee or candidate for state office; (5) a commercially reasonable loan made in 16 the ordinary course of the lender's business on terms that 17 are available to all similarly qualified borrowers; 18 reimbursement for out-of-pocket expenses 19 (6) 20 actually incurred in the course of performing a service for the person making the reimbursement; 21 any gift accepted on behalf of and to be 22 (7) used by the state or a political subdivision of the state, 23 including travel, subsistence and related expenses accepted 24 by a state agency in connection with a state officer's or 25

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1 employee's official duties that take place away from the 2 state official's or employee's station of duty; 3 (8) anything for which fair market value is paid or reimbursed by the state officer or employee or 4 5 candidate for state office; (9) reasonable expenses for a bona fide 6 educational program that is directly related to the state 7 8 officer's or employee's official duties; or (10) a retirement gift; 9 "market value" means the retail cost a person C. 10 would incur to purchase a gift; 11 D. "restricted donor" means a person who: 12 is or is seeking to be a party to any 13 (1) one or any combination of sales, purchases, leases or 14 15 contracts to, from or with the agency in which the donee holds office or is employed; 16 (2) will personally be, or is the agent of a 17 person who will be, directly and substantially affected 18 financially by the performance or nonperformance of the 19 20 donee's official duty in a way that is greater than the effect on the public generally or on a substantial class of 21 persons to which the person belongs as a member of a 22 profession, occupation, industry or region; 23 is personally, or is the agent of a 24 (3) person who is, the subject of or party to a matter that is 25

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pending before a regulatory agency and over which the donee has discretionary authority as part of the donee's official duties or employment within the regulatory agency; or

is a lobbyist or a client of a lobbyist (4) with respect to matters within the donee's jurisdiction; and

E. "state officer or employee" means any person who has been elected to, appointed to or hired for any state office and who receives compensation in the form of salary or is eligible for per diem or mileage.

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Section 3. LIMITATION ON GIFTS.--

A. A state officer or employee or a candidate for 11 state office, or that person's family, shall not knowingly 12 accept from a restricted donor, and a restricted donor shall 13 not knowingly donate to a state officer or employee or a 14 15 candidate for state office, or that person's family, a gift of a market value greater than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250).

B. A lobbyist registered with the secretary of 18 state, the lobbyist's employer or a government contractor 19 20 shall not donate gifts of an aggregate market value greater than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) in a calendar year to any 21 one state officer or employee or to any one candidate for 22 state office. 23

A state officer or employee shall not solicit C. 24 gifts for a charity from a business or corporation regulated 25

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1	by the state agency for which the state officer or employee	
2	works and shall not otherwise solicit donations for a charity	
3	in such a manner that it appears that the purpose of the	
4	donor in making the gift is to influence the state officer or	
5	employee in the performance of an official duty.	
6	Section 4. PENALTIESA person who violates the	
7	provisions of the Gift Act is guilty of a petty misdemeanor	
8	and upon conviction shall be sentenced in accordance with the	
9	provisions of Section 31-19-1 NMSA 1978	SJC/SB 931
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
