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7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
8	Section 1. A new section of the Crime Victims
9	Reparation Act is enacted to read:
10	"DOMESTIC VIOLENCE HOMICIDE REVIEW TEAMCREATION
11	MEMBERSHIPDUTIESCONFIDENTIALITYCIVIL LIABILITY
12	A. The "domestic violence homicide review team" is
13	created within the commission for the purpose of reviewing
14	the facts and circumstances of domestic violence related
15	homicides and sexual assault related homicides in New Mexico,
16	identifying the causes of the fatalities and their
17	relationship to government and nongovernment service delivery
18	systems and developing methods of domestic violence
19	prevention.
20	B. The team shall consist of the following members
21	appointed by the director of the commission:
22	(1) medical personnel with expertise in
23	domestic violence;
24	(2) criminologists;

1 district attorneys association; 2 (4) representatives from the attorney 3 general; (5) victim services providers; 4 5 (6) civil legal services providers; (7) representatives from the public defender 6 department; 7 8 (8) members of the judiciary; (9) law enforcement personnel; 9 10 (10) representatives from the department of health, the aging and long-term services department and the 11 children, youth and families department who deal with 12 domestic violence victims' issues; 13 (11) representatives from tribal 14 15 organizations who deal with domestic violence; and any other members the director of the 16 (12)commission deems appropriate. 17 C. The domestic violence homicide review team 18 shall: 19 20 (1) review trends and patterns of domestic violence related homicides and sexual assault related 21 homicides in New Mexico; 22 evaluate the responses of government and (2) 23 nongovernment service delivery systems and offer 24 recommendations for improvement of the responses; 25 SB 1092 Page 2

1 identify and characterize high-risk (3) 2 groups for the purpose of recommending developments in public 3 policy; (4) collect statistical data in a consistent 4 5 and uniform manner on the occurrence of domestic violence 6 related homicides and sexual assault related homicides; and 7 (5) improve collaboration between tribal, state and local agencies and organizations to develop 8 initiatives to prevent domestic violence. 9 D. The following items are confidential: 10 all records, reports or other 11 (1)information obtained or created by the domestic violence 12 homicide review team for the purpose of reviewing domestic 13 violence related homicides or sexual assault related 14 15 homicides pursuant to this section; and 16 (2) all communications made by domestic violence homicide review team members or other persons during 17 a review conducted by the team of a domestic violence related 18 homicide or a sexual assault related homicide. 19 20 Ε. The following persons shall honor the confidentiality requirements of this section and shall not 21 make disclosure of any matter related to the team's review of 22 a domestic violence related homicide or a sexual assault 23 related homicide, except pursuant to appropriate court 24 orders: 25

9 F. Nothing in this section shall prevent the discovery or admissibility of any evidence that is otherwise discoverable or admissible merely because the evidence was presented during the review of a domestic violence related homicide or a sexual assault related homicide pursuant to this section.

G. Domestic violence homicide review team members shall not be subject to civil liability for any act related to the review of a domestic violence related homicide or a sexual assault related homicide; provided that the members act in good faith, without malice and in compliance with other state or federal law.

H. An organization, institution, agency or person
who provides testimony, records, reports or other information
to the domestic violence homicide review team for the purpose
of reviewing domestic violence related homicides or sexual
assault related homicides shall not be subject to civil

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1 liability for providing the testimony, records, reports or 2 other information to the team; provided that the 3 organization, institution, agency or person acts in good faith, without malice and in compliance with other state or 4 5 federal law. I. At least thirty days prior to the convening of 6 7 each regular session of the legislature, the domestic 8 violence homicide review team shall transmit a report of its 9 activities pursuant to this section to: 10 (1) the governor; the legislative council; 11 (2) (3) the chief justice of the supreme court; 12 (4) the secretary of public safety; 13 the secretary of children, youth and 14 (5) families; 15 (6) the secretary of health; and 16 (7) any other persons the team deems 17 appropriate." 18 Section 2.
