15	(1) while the person is in the interior of a	
16	bedroom, bathroom, changing room, fitting room, dressing room	
17	or tanning booth or the interior of any other area in which	
18	the person has a reasonable expectation of privacy; or	
19	(2) under circumstances where the person has	
20	a reasonable expectation of privacy, whether in a public or	
21	private place.	
22	B. Whoever commits voyeurism is guilty of a	
23	misdemeanor, except if the victim is less than eighteen years	
24	of age, the offender is guilty of a fourth degree felony.

1	(1) "intimate areas" means the primary	
2	genital area, groin, buttocks, anus or breasts or the	
3	undergarments that cover those areas; and	
4	(2) "instrumentality" means a periscope,

7	or electronic device of any type."
