2	URGING CONGRESS TO INCREASE FUNDING FOR NEW MEXICO'S
3	LOW-INCOME HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

5	WHEREAS, the cost of energy for residential use has been
6	increasing dramatically in the United States and in New
7	Mexico; and
8	WHEREAS, low-income customers are particularly
9	vulnerable to increases in their energy bills for
10	electricity, natural gas and propane both to heat and cool
11	their homes during extreme weather conditions; and
12	WHEREAS, the primary federal program assisting
13	low-income families with their energy costs is the low-income
14	home energy assistance program, which provides support both
15	for family utility bill payments and for increased energy
16	efficiency through home weatherization programs; and
17	WHEREAS, expenditure for the low-income home energy
18	assistance program is authorized for five billion one hundred
19	million dollars (\$5,100,000,000) in the federal budget, of
20	which two billion two hundred million dollars
21	(\$2,200,000,000) has been appropriated by congress for fiscal
22	year 2007; and
23	WHEREAS, the two billion two hundred million dollars
24	(\$2,200,000,000) appropriated by congress is not adequate to
25	support the winter heating needs of low-income families for

the winter of 2006-2007; and

WHEREAS, the authorized amount is not sufficient to begin to meet the urgent public health needs in warm-weather states such as New Mexico, which has experienced lethal periods of extreme heat that has killed hundreds of vulnerable members of New Mexico's population in the past year; and

8 WHEREAS, there exists an extensive network of low-income 9 home energy assistance program providers that are public and 10 nonprofit agencies that can efficiently disburse the 11 increased funds resulting from an increased appropriation for 12 the public welfare;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
STATE OF NEW MEXICO to call on congress to increase the
budget authorization for the low-income home energy
assistance program to seven billion dollars (\$7,000,000,000)
for fiscal year 2007 and appropriate the entire authorized
amount to the states; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the members of the New Mexico congressional delegation.
