6	cause of death and stroke and the third-leading cause of

8	WHEREAS, cardiovascular diseases claim the lives of over		
9	four hundred sixty thousand American women each year, or an		
10	estimated one death per minute; and		
11	WHEREAS, each year, fifty-three percent of all		
12	cardiovascular disease deaths occur in women as compared to		
13	forty-seven percent in men; and		
14	WHEREAS, each year, approximately thirty-two thousand		
15	eight hundred more women than men die from a stroke; and		
16	WHEREAS, in 2007 the estimated direct and indirect costs		
17	of cardiovascular diseases and stroke in the United States is		
18	estimated at four hundred thirty-one billion eight hundred		
19	million dollars (\$431,800,000,000); and		
20	WHEREAS, more women die of cardiovascular disease than		
21	the next five leading causes of death combined, including all		
22	cancers; and		
23	WHEREAS, only thirteen percent of women consider		
24	cardiovascular disease their greatest health risk; and		
25	WHEREAS, February is designated as American heart month;	SM 1 Page	1

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WHEREAS, "go red for women" is the American heart association's national call to increase awareness about heart disease, the leading cause of death for women, and to inspire women to take charge of their heart health; and

WHEREAS, all women should learn their own personal risk for heart disease, using tools such as the American heart association's "go red for women" heart checkup and by talking to their health care providers;
