1 A MEMORIAL 2 REQUESTING THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH REPORT ON THE COSTS 3 IN NEW MEXICO OF SICKLE CELL DISEASE, WHICH DISPROPORTIONATELY AFFECTS AFRICAN AMERICAN AND HISPANIC NEW 4 5 MEXICANS. 6 WHEREAS, sickle cell disease is the most common 7 8 inherited blood disorder in the country; and WHEREAS, sickle cell disease creates a chronic, painful 9 condition that affects people throughout their lives; and 10 11 WHEREAS, in the United States, most patients with sickle cell disease are of African, Hispanic or Mediterranean 12 descent; and 13 WHEREAS, people of all ethnic backgrounds can have 14 15 sickle cell disease; and 16 WHEREAS, about one in three hundred seventy-five African American babies and one in one thousand to one thousand four 17 hundred Hispanic babies are diagnosed with sickle cell 18 disease each year in the United States; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the average lifespan of a person with sickle cell disease is only forty-five years; and 21 WHEREAS, approximately one in every four thousand 22 Americans is born with a form of sickle cell disease; and 23 WHEREAS, two and one-half million Americans have the 24 sickle cell trait; and 25 SM 43 Page 1 WHEREAS, sickle cell disease affects the lives of thousands who are hampered by physical and mental limitations and debilitating pain; and

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WHEREAS, while research and treatment are progressing, patients with sickle cell disease suffer from dangerous blood clots and are prone to strokes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE
STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the department of health be
requested to study the affects and incidence of sickle cell
disease in New Mexico; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the department of health be requested to report to the interim legislative health and human services committee on its findings by the committee's November 2007 meeting; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the secretary of health, the chair and vice-chair of the health and human services committee and to the governor.

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
