SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 1065 amends Section 4-41-16 NMSA 1978 to increase the amount allowed to be charged by a county sheriff for service of a writ, citation, order, subpoena or summons from \$30 to \$40.

The effective date of the act is July 1, 2007.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

HB 1065 should increase the Sheriff Department's revenue considerably; this is a 25% increase to their fees.

There will be a minimal administrative cost for statewide update, distribution and documentation of statutory changes.
