Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 992 appropriates \$200.0 from the General Fund to the Local Government Division of the Department of Finance and Administration for expenditure in FY08 to plan and promote a celebration recognizing the four-hundred-year anniversary of the founding of Santa Fe.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS
