#### **SUMMARY**

## Synopsis of Bill

Senate Joint Memorial 14 urges Congress to fund all costs of medical care and attendant services for children of Vietnam veterans affected with level-III cases of Spina Bifida. Under Public Law 104-204, the 104<sup>th</sup> Congress acknowledged the correlation of Spina Bifida in children of parents exposed to Agent Orange in Vietnam

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Senate Joint Memorial 14 has no fiscal implications at the state level.

## **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

In addition to acknowledging the relation of exposure to herbicide and Spina Bifida in the subsequent generation, the law authorized lifetime health services and disability payments paid monthly for these children. Health issues independent of Spina Bifida do not qualify for health services benefits under the federal legislation. Children affected with level-III Spina Bifida and

recognized by the United States department of Veterans' Affairs number approximately two-hundred (200). Level-III sufferers have significant medical costs exceeding monthly federal disability stipends and many require hospice or attendant health-care services, appliances, and other treatments not covered under the current law.

Enactment of Senate Joint Memorial 14 would urge policymakers at the federal level to expand total benefits to a small, sub-set of already acknowledged and recognized disabled children of those exposed to the herbicide Agent Orange while serving in Vietnam.

## **ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS**

If enacted, copies of Senate Joint Memorial 14 need to be distributed to the New Mexico congressional delegation, the chief clerks of the U.S. House and Senate, and to the U.S. department of Veterans' Affairs.
