NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that appreciation be extended to the economic development department for the work it has done to promote the passage of tax and business incentives that improve New Mexico's business climate for manufacturers; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the economic development department be requested to consider other incentives that would serve to help recruit and retain manufacturers in New Mexico, and that the department be encouraged to recommend to the interim revenue stabilization and tax policy committee those tax incentives it believes will strengthen New Mexico's business climate; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be transmitted to the secretary of economic development.
