WHEREAS, there is also a need for transportation for children who want to experience outdoor education programs; and

WHEREAS, coordination among state agencies will be required to increase the use of public lands by students; and

WHEREAS, a 2005 study found that outdoor, interactive education can increase student test scores, reduce discipline problems, build citizenry skills and increase teacher job satisfaction; and

WHEREAS, a partnership between the state parks division of the energy, minerals and natural resources department and the public education department would have enormous potential to inspire education of New Mexico's children, benefit state parks and better serve the state;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the state parks division of the energy, minerals and natural resources department be requested to convene a task force composed of representatives of the department of game and fish, the public education department, the national park service, the United States fish and wildlife service and the New Mexico retail association to plan for ways to maximize student use of the state's precious public lands; and
