A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE NEW MEXICO LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO DIRECT THE APPROPRIATE COMMITTEE TO REVIEW THE DEPARTMENT OF GAME AND FISH'S COOPERATIVE WORK WITH THE UNITED STATES FOREST SERVICE AND OTHER AGENCIES AND PARTIES TO COORDINATE EFFORTS TO MAXIMIZE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE NATIONAL FOREST LAND MANAGEMENT PLAN AND HELP SOLVE RELATED ISSUES.

WHEREAS, Lincoln national forest is working on its national forest land management plan; and

WHEREAS, watershed restoration must be an integral part of this national forest land management plan; and

WHEREAS, grazing permits on national forest, state and bureau of land management lands are contingent upon availability of forage; and

WHEREAS, the abundance of wild game, in particular elk, .164330.2

has become a management issue concerning available forage; and

WHEREAS, the quality and quantity of sustainable water resources have an economic impact on counties located in the Lincoln national forest watershed;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico legislative council be requested to direct the appropriate committee to review the department of game and fish's work to coordinate efforts to maximize the effectiveness of the national forest land management plan and help solve related issues; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that, in this endeavor, the department of game and fish report to the appropriate legislative committee; southeast and south central New Mexico legislators; county commissioners from Otero, Eddy, Chaves and Lincoln counties; the interstate stream commission; the state engineer; the United States forest service; the bureau of land management; the state land commissioner; the state forester; the New Mexico cattle growers' association; the New Mexico association of conservation districts; and other interested parties; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the state game commission and the members of the New Mexico legislative council.
