WHEREAS, Lonnie Sumpter was appointed executive director of the New Mexico office of space commercialization but had to leave his position due to illness; and

WHEREAS, Lonnie Sumpter continued to make an invaluable contribution to New Mexico's commercial space program with his innovative systems engineering approach to flight safety analyses in support of reusable launch operations, as well as his presentations on the unlimited possibilities for New Mexico in commercial space; and

WHEREAS, Lonnie Sumpter was appointed to New Mexico's military base planning commission and personally developed a description of New Mexico's military advantages, which was included in the state's presentation to the United States department of defense base realignment and closure commission in support of saving Cannon air force base during the base realignment and closure round in 2005; and

WHEREAS, Lonnie Sumpter was appointed director of New Mexico's spaceport authority, where he worked closely with the rocket racing league, UP Aerospace and Virgin Galactic
