REQUESTING A STUDY OF CABINET SECRETARY AND AGENCY DIRECTOR
SALARIES TO ENSURE REASONABLENESS OF THOSE SALARIES, TO ENSURE

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the department of finance and administration be requested to study the salary ranges for cabinet secretaries and agency directors in New Mexico; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study include an analysis of how state compensation packages compare to those paid in the private sector for executives with duties and responsibilities comparable to those of cabinet secretaries and agency directors; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study make recommendations for any adjustments to the current salary ranges; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the department of finance and administration report the findings and recommendations of the study to the legislative finance committee before November 1, 2007; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the department of finance and administration.
