AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SEVERANCE TAX BONDS; CREATING A FUND; AUTHORIZING DISTRIBUTIONS FROM THE FUND FOR CERTAIN PROJECTS; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Severance Tax Bonding Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] AUTHORIZATION FOR SEVERANCE TAX BONDS FOR SEVERANCE TAX TRANSPORTATION FUND--APPROPRIATION OF PROCEEDS.--

A. The state board of finance may issue and sell severance tax bonds in fiscal years 2007 through 2012 in compliance with the Severance Tax Bonding Act in an amount not exceeding a total of two hundred eight million dollars (\$208,000,000) when the department of transportation certifies

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1 the need for the issuance of the bonds; provided that no more
2 than the lesser of fifty million dollars (\$50,000,000) or
3 fifteen percent of severance tax bonding capacity, as
4 determined pursuant to Section 7-27-10.1 NMSA 1978, may be used
5 in any one fiscal year. The state board of finance shall
6 schedule the issuance and sale of the bonds in the most
7 expeditious and economical manner possible upon a finding by
8 the board that, based upon a certification from the department
9 of transportation, the proceeds of the bonds are needed and
10 that the projects can proceed to contract within a reasonable
11 time. The state board of finance shall further take the
12 appropriate steps necessary to comply with the federal Internal
13 Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The state board of finance
14 may issue and sell the bonds in the same manner as other
15 severance tax bonds in an amount not to exceed the authorized
16 amount provided for in this subsection. Any amount not
17 certified for issuance in a fiscal year may be carried forward
18 and credited against the amount to be certified in subsequent
19 fiscal years.

20 B. The proceeds from the sale of the bonds are
21 appropriated to the severance tax transportation fund for
22 distribution as directed by the department of transportation
23 for projects pursuant to Section 6-21-6.12 NMSA 1978.

24 C. Money from the severance tax bonds provided for
25 in this section shall not be used to pay indirect costs. If

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1 the department of transportation has not certified the need for
2 the issuance of the bonds by April 1, 2012, the authorization
3 provided in this section shall expire."

4 Section 2. A new section of the New Mexico Finance
5 Authority Act, Section 6-21-6.12 NMSA 1978, is enacted to read:

6 "6-21-6.12. [NEW MATERIAL] SEVERANCE TAX TRANSPORTATION
7 FUND--CREATED--DISTRIBUTIONS.--

8 A. The "severance tax transportation fund" is
9 created within the authority. The fund shall be administered
10 by the authority as a separate account, but may consist of
11 subaccounts if the authority deems them necessary to carry out
12 the purpose of the fund. The fund shall consist of severance
13 tax bond proceeds appropriated to the fund and, except as
14 provided in Subsection E of this section, all earnings of the
15 fund.

16 B. Except as provided in Subsection D of this
17 section, upon certification by the department of transportation
18 that a project has been approved for payment and upon
19 compliance with the requirements of this section, money in the
20 fund shall be distributed to local governments for projects
21 specifically authorized by the legislature. The authority
22 shall issue payment to the local government named in the
23 project application and certification.

24 C. Except as provided in Subsection D of this
25 section, distributions from the fund shall be made pursuant to

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1 the following criteria:

2 (1) the department of transportation shall
3 establish funding priorities and qualifications for the
4 transportation projects that are certified for funding from the
5 fund;

6 (2) distributions from the fund shall be used
7 to pay no more than the state's portion of the total cost
8 necessary to develop and construct the project as presented in
9 the approved application;

10 (3) to qualify for funding, a local government
11 shall apply for funding through the department of
12 transportation's regional or metropolitan planning
13 organizations;

14 (4) a local government shall show, to the
15 satisfaction of the department of transportation, that it will
16 match the distribution from the severance tax transportation
17 fund in the following amounts:

18 (a) for a project with a total cost of
19 less than five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000), the local
20 government shall contribute ten percent of the total project
21 cost;

22 (b) for a project with a total cost of
23 five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) or greater, but less
24 than or equal to one million dollars (\$1,000,000), the local
25 government shall contribute twenty percent of the total project

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1 cost;

2 (c) for a project with a total cost
3 greater than one million dollars (\$1,000,000), but less than or
4 equal to six million dollars (\$6,000,000), the local government
5 shall contribute thirty-five percent of the total project cost;
6 and

7 (d) for a project with a total project
8 cost greater than six million dollars (\$6,000,000), the local
9 government shall contribute forty-five percent of the total
10 project cost; and

11 (5) in determining the sufficiency of a local
12 government's matching contribution, the department shall
13 consider actual funds, in-kind contributions, preconstruction
14 design and development costs and other related expenditures
15 made in the furtherance of the project. Matching fund sources
16 may be any money available to the local government for the
17 project, including:

18 (a) grants or loans by the authority
19 from the local transportation infrastructure fund;

20 (b) appropriations from local government
21 road funds;

22 (c) community development block grants;

23 and

24 (d) available federal funds.

25 D. Notwithstanding the requirements of Subsections

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1 B and C of this section:

2 (1) up to a total of twenty-five million
3 dollars (\$25,000,000) shall be distributed from the fund for
4 the acquisition of rights of way, planning, design and
5 construction of drainage and paving improvements and
6 transportation infrastructure improvements related to the
7 spaceport in Sierra county and Dona Ana county, which shall be
8 funded from the fund without a requirement for a local match;
9 and

10 (2) up to five hundred thousand dollars
11 (\$500,000) of the fund may be expended by the department of
12 transportation for engineering and design services to develop
13 the projects funded with distributions from the fund without a
14 requirement for a local match.

15 E. Earnings from investing the fund may be
16 distributed by the authority to the department of
17 transportation to be used for payment of administrative costs
18 associated with the fund, including payment for engineering
19 costs.

20 F. As used in this section:

21 (1) "fund" means the severance tax
22 transportation fund; and

23 (2) "local government" means a municipality
24 acting within its planning and platting jurisdiction, a county
25 or an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo."

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1 Section 3. PROJECTS AUTHORIZED FOR DISTRIBUTIONS FROM THE
2 SEVERANCE TAX TRANSPORTATION FUND.--Pursuant to the provisions
3 of Section 6-21-6.12 NMSA 1978, upon certification by the
4 department of transportation that the need exists for a
5 distribution from the severance tax transportation fund and
6 pursuant to the requirements of that section, the following
7 amounts are appropriated to the department of transportation to
8 be distributed for the following purposes:

9 1. six million two hundred eighty-five thousand
10 seven hundred dollars (\$6,285,700) for acquisition of rights of
11 way, planning, design and construction of roadway drainage,
12 paving and intersection improvements, including landscaping,
13 for Unser boulevard south of Central avenue in the city of
14 Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

15 2. three million four hundred thirty-seven thousand
16 five hundred dollars (\$3,437,500) for Rio Bravo interchange
17 improvements in Bernalillo county;

18 3. four million four hundred thousand dollars
19 (\$4,400,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
20 and construction of roadway drainage and paving improvements on
21 Edith boulevard between Candelaria road and Montano road in
22 Bernalillo county;

23 4. two million seven hundred thirty thousand
24 dollars (\$2,730,000) for acquisition of rights of way,
25 planning, design and construction of roadway, safety and paving

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1 improvements, including signalization of intersections on
2 Fourth street, in the village of Los Ranchos de Albuquerque in
3 Bernalillo county;

4 5. two million six hundred thousand dollars
5 (\$2,600,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
6 and construction of a new roadway east of the city of Roswell
7 in Chaves county;

8 6. nine hundred ten thousand dollars (\$910,000) for
9 acquisition of rights of way, planning, design and construction
10 of roadway drainage and paving improvements of local streets in
11 the town of Dexter in Chaves county;

12 7. two million three hundred eight thousand seven
13 hundred dollars (\$2,308,700) for acquisition of rights of way,
14 planning, design and new construction of roadway drainage and
15 paving for west College boulevard extension from north Sycamore
16 avenue west to the Roswell relief route in the city of Roswell
17 in Chaves county;

18 8. two million eight hundred fifty-one thousand
19 nine hundred dollars (\$2,851,900) for acquisition of rights of
20 way, planning, design and construction of new bridge and
21 roadway drainage and paving improvements for a railroad grade
22 separation bridge connecting bureau of Indian affairs roads 30
23 and 36 in the Pueblo of Acoma in Cibola county;

24 9. four hundred fifty-two thousand eight hundred
25 dollars (\$452,800) for acquisition of rights of way, planning,

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1 design and construction of roadway and drainage improvements on
2 C-41, Pie Town road and south Bloomfield road to the Ramah high
3 school complex in Cibola county;

4 10. one million one hundred five thousand dollars
5 (\$1,105,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
6 and construction of roadway, drainage and bridge improvements
7 on east Roosevelt avenue in the city of Grants in Cibola
8 county;

9 11. one million six hundred twenty-five thousand
10 dollars (\$1,625,000) for the acquisition of rights of way,
11 planning, design and construction of ramps and access roadway
12 improvements to the route 66 casino in the Pueblo of Laguna in
13 Cibola county;

14 12. seven hundred forty-one thousand dollars
15 (\$741,000) for the acquisition of rights of way, planning,
16 design and construction of roadway and drainage improvements,
17 including curbs, gutters and sidewalks, on Pinon drive in the
18 village of Milan in Cibola county;

19 13. two million nine hundred twenty-five thousand
20 dollars (\$2,925,000) for the acquisition of rights of way,
21 planning, design and construction of roadway drainage and
22 paving improvements for reconstruction and rehabilitation of
23 roads within the Ramah chapter of the Navajo Nation in Cibola
24 county;

25 14. nine hundred seventy-five thousand dollars

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1 (\$975,000) for the acquisition of rights of way, planning,
2 design and construction of roadway drainage and paving
3 improvements to Back Basin road in the village of Angel Fire in
4 Colfax county;

5 15. four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) for
6 rights of way, planning, design and construction of roadway and
7 drainage improvements to resurface streets in the village of
8 Cimarron in Colfax county;

9 16. six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000) for
10 planning and inventory of all county roads and construction of
11 roadway improvements for various county roads in Colfax county;

12 17. one million three hundred thousand dollars
13 (\$1,300,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
14 and construction of roadway drainage and paving improvements to
15 south Tomboy drive and Willow Creek drive in the village of
16 Eagle Nest in Colfax county;

17 18. two million six hundred thousand dollars
18 (\$2,600,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
19 and construction of roadway drainage and paving improvements at
20 various locations in the city of Raton in Colfax county;

21 19. three million two hundred fifty thousand
22 dollars (\$3,250,000) for acquisition of rights of way,
23 planning, design and construction of roadway drainage and
24 paving improvements, including lighting, curbs and gutters,
25 medians and sidewalks, for Maxwell avenue and Railroad avenue

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1 in the town of Springer in Colfax county;

2 20. one million seven hundred fifty-five thousand
3 dollars (\$1,755,000) for acquisition of rights of way,
4 planning, design and construction of roadway drainage and
5 paving improvements on Prince street in the city of Clovis in
6 Curry county;

7 21. one million one hundred eighty-three thousand
8 dollars (\$1,183,000) for acquisition of rights of way,
9 planning, design and construction of roadway drainage and
10 paving improvements to county road 3 in Curry county;

11 22. four hundred ninety-six thousand dollars
12 (\$496,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
13 and construction of roadway drainage and paving improvements
14 for reconstruction of Seventeenth street for access to Airport
15 Industrial road in Fort Sumner in De Baca county;

16 23. nine hundred seventy-five thousand dollars

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1 25. three million fifty-five thousand dollars
2 (\$3,055,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
3 and construction of roadway drainage, paving and widening of
4 Anapra road in the city of Sunland Park in Dona Ana county;

5 26. six hundred forty-eight thousand dollars
6 (\$648,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design

3 dollars (\$1,625,000) for planning, design and construction of

7 32. one million nine hundred fifty thousand dollars
8 (\$1,950,000) for acquisition of rights of way, planning, design
9 and construction of roadway drainage and paving improvements to
10 resurface and improve Hutchinson street and Pinon street in the
11 village of Santa Clara in Grant county;

12 33. three million seven hundred thirty thousand one
13 hundred dollars (\$3,730,100) for acquisition of rights of way,
