Bill Summary:

SB 173 makes an appropriation to support existing character education program in public schools.

Fiscal Impact:

\$250,000 is appropriated from the General Fund to the Public Education Department (PED) for FY 09. The bill contains a reversion clause.

Issues:

According to PED, New Mexico has received a total of almost \$4.0 million in federal funding for character education over the last 12 years. PED is currently in the last year of a four-year grant that will end on July 31, 2008. Schools and districts statewide have implemented many fine character education programs over the years. Most recently, many have introduced *Pursuing Victory with Honor* as part of grant activities in cooperation with the New Mexico Activities Association sportsmanship objectives. By fostering good character through teaching, enforcing, advocating and modeling the õSix Pillars of Characteröô trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring, and good citizenshipô schools and communities provide an essential component of studentøs education. PED believes that it is important to continue this program statewide.
