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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
14	Section 1. Section 22-13-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1972,
15	Chapter 95, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:
16	"22-13-6. SPECIAL EDUCATIONDEFINITIONSAs used in the
17	Public School Code:
18	A. "special education" means the provision of
19	services additional to, supplementary to or different from
20	those provided in the regular school program by a systematic
21	modification and adaptation of instructional techniques,
22	materials and equipment to meet the needs of exceptional
23	children;
24	B. "exceptional children" means school-age persons
25	whose abilities render regular services of the public school to
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1	be inconsistent with their educational needs;		
2	C. "children with disabilities" means those		
3	children who are classified as developmentally disabled		
4	according to the Developmental Disabilities Act; [and]		
5	D. "gifted child" means a school-age person who is		
6	determined to be gifted pursuant to Section 22-13-6.1 NMSA 1978		
7	and standards adopted by the [state board] department pursuant		
8	to that section. Nothing in this section shall preclude a		
9	school district from offering additional gifted programs for		
10	students who fail to meet the eligibility criteria; however,		
11	the state shall only provide state funds for [department of		
12	education approved] department-approved gifted programs for		
13	those students who meet the established criteria;		
14	E. "related services" means the developmental,		
15	corrective and other supportive services that are required to		
16	assist a child with a disability to benefit from special		
17	education. Related services include:		
18	(1) speech-language pathology and audiology		
19	services;		
20	(2) interpreting services;		
21	(3) psychological services;		
22	(4) physical and occupational therapy;		
23	(5) recreation, including therapeutic		
24	recreation;		
25	(6) early identification and assessment of		
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1	disabilities in children;		
2	(7) counseling services, including		
3	rehabilitation counseling;		
4	(8) orientation and mobility services;		
5	(9) medical services for diagnostic or		
6	evaluation purposes;		
7	(10) school health services and school nurse		
8	services;		
9	(11) social work services in schools; and		
10	(12) parent counseling and training; and		
11	F. "related service provider" means a person who is		
12	employed to assist children with disabilities to benefit from		
13	special education, including:		
14	(1) diagnostician;		
15	(2) social worker;		
16	(3) speech-language pathologist and speech-		
17	language apprentice;		
18	(4) physical therapist and physical therapy		
19	assistant;		
20	(5) occupational therapist and certified		
21	occupational therapy assistant;		
22	(6) audiologist;		
23	(7) interpreter for the deaf;		
24	(8) orientation and mobility trainer;		
25	<pre>(9) school psychologist;</pre>		
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(10) therapeutic recreation specialist;
(11) rehabilitation counselor; and
(12) special education medical or nursing
services provider."
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
