PURPOSE OF ACT.--The purpose of the American 21 Indian Post-Secondary Education Act is to: 22 assist in the development of culturally relevant 23 learning environments and post-secondary educational 24 opportunities for American Indian students; 25 foster maintenance of native languages and

- C. provide for the study, development and implementation of post-secondary educational programs that have a positive impact on the educational success of American Indian students:
- establish a framework for a formal relationship between the department and tribal colleges and develop relationships with the education division of the bureau of Indian affairs and other entities that serve American Indian students; and
- provide a mechanism for tribal colleges and other tribal educational agencies; the department; postsecondary educational institutions; students and parents; community-based organizations; the public education department; and tribal, state and local policymakers to work together to improve post-secondary educational opportunities for American Indian students.
- Section 3. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the American Indian Post-Secondary Education Act:
- "department" means the higher education department;
- "division" means the American Indian post-В. secondary education division of the department;
- "post-secondary educational institutions" means public and tribal post-secondary educational institutions .170929.1

- D. "secretary" means the secretary of higher education:
- E. "tribal college" means a tribally, federally or congressionally chartered post-secondary educational institution located in New Mexico that is accredited by the north central association of colleges and schools; and
- F. "tribe" means an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo located within New Mexico.
- Section 4. DEPARTMENT--RULES--JOINT POWERS AGREEMENTS AND MEMORANDA OF UNDERSTANDING.--
- A. The department, in consultation with tribes, may adopt and promulgate rules to implement the provisions of the American Indian Post-Secondary Education Act.
- B. The secretary may enter into joint powers agreements with tribal colleges and tribes, and into memoranda of understanding with New Mexico higher education entities and institutions, for data collection and data sharing and for other matters necessary to carry out the provisions of the American Indian Post-Secondary Education Act.
- Section 5. AMERICAN INDIAN POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION
 DIVISION--CREATED--DUTIES.--
- A. The "American Indian post-secondary education division" is created within the department. The secretary shall appoint a director of American Indian post-secondary .170929.1

education, who shall direct the activities of the division.

В. The division shall:

- (1) provide assistance to post-secondary educational institutions to meet the higher education needs of American Indian students;
- (2) provide assistance to post-secondary educational institutions in the planning, development, implementation and evaluation of recruitment and retention strategies designed for American Indian college students;
- (3) seek funds to establish, develop and implement services to increase the enrollment, retention and graduation rates of American Indians in post-secondary educational institutions, including programs to improve:
 - recruitment; (a)
 - (b) retention;
 - academic support and transition; and (c)
 - financial aid available to American (d)

Indian students:

- develop a system for consistent data collection and sharing on the enrollment, retention and graduation rates of American Indian students at post-secondary educational institutions;
- (5) collaborate with the public education department on initiatives related to pre-kindergarten through grade twenty, higher education grants and teacher education to .170929.1

promote an integrated seamless educational system for American Indian students:

(6) at least semiannually, hold a public meeting for representatives of New Mexico higher education entities and institutions, tribes, post-secondary educational institutions, American Indian students, the governor's office, the Indian affairs department, the public education department, the legislature and other interested persons to discuss American Indian higher education issues, including ways to foster attendance and graduation of American Indian students from post-secondary educational institutions; and

(7) coordinate with the public education department to encourage appointment of members of the Indian education advisory council who also represent institutions of higher education.

Section 6. STATUS REPORT. --

A. Each public post-secondary educational institution shall submit a biannual American Indian post-secondary education status report to the division as provided in this section. The division shall encourage post-secondary educational institutions and other entities that serve American Indian college students to submit a status report.

B. The division shall compile the information received into a single American Indian post-secondary education status report.

1	C. The status report provided by each post-
2	secondary educational institution shall be written in a brief
3	format and shall include the following information by which the
4	institution's performance is measured and aligned with the
5	department's strategic priorities:
6	(1) student recruitment;
7	(2) student retention;
8	(3) student attrition;
9	(4) student remediation programs;

(6) annual goals and objectives of American Indian education programs;

- (7) financial aid reports; and
- (8) other issues identified by the division or recommended by the biannual public meetings.
- Section 7. AMERICAN INDIAN POST-SECONDARY EDUCATION FUND CREATED--GRANTS--APPLICATION AND AWARD PROCESS.--
- A. The "American Indian post-secondary education fund" is created in the state treasury. The fund consists of appropriations, gifts, grants, donations and income from investment of the fund. Balances in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert or be transferred to any other fund. The fund shall be administered by the department, and money in the fund is appropriated to the department to award grants in support of the American Indian Post-Secondary

Education Act. Disbursements from the fund shall be by warrant of the secretary of finance and administration on vouchers signed by the secretary of higher education or the secretary's authorized representative.

- B. Grants may be awarded for special projects related to recruitment, retention and graduation of American Indian students, including student conferences, cultural awareness training for faculty and staff at post-secondary educational institutions, academic support and transition programs and other projects approved by the division.
- c. Applications for grants from the fund shall be in the form prescribed by the division. The division, with the secretary's approval, shall promulgate rules governing the application and award process, setting forth requirements for eligibility, the process for ranking applications and awarding grants; accounting, financial reporting and evaluation requirements for grantees; reporting requirements on the use of grants and the outcomes of projects funded; and any other information deemed necessary by the division.
- D. The department shall require that all projects supported by grants from the fund be evaluated annually; shall monitor the implementation of the projects; and shall discontinue funding a project after three years if the project is not achieving the measurable objectives stated in its grant application. The department shall allow no more than three .170929.1

percent of grant funds awarded for a project to be used for an external project evaluation of the project.

Section 8. APPROPRIATION. --

Nine hundred thousand dollars (\$900,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the American Indian postsecondary education fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2009 and subsequent fiscal years to make grants for projects funded in accordance with the American Indian Post-Secondary Education Act. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund.

One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the higher education department for expenditure in fiscal year 2009 for operational expenses associated with the American Indian post-secondary education division; the conduct of the first semiannual meeting as provided in Section 5 of the American Indian Post-Secondary Education Act; and the development of a data collection and data sharing system for post-secondary educational institutions as provided in that act. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the general fund.
