(d) one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for the behavioral health collaborative's development of a flex-funding program for the autism spectrum disorder population; and

(\$350,000) for behavioral health collaborative seed money for development of in-state residential treatment centers for the autism spectrum disorder population, including related policies, standards and oversights; and

(2) to the department of health:

(a) one million dollars (\$1,000,000) to support statewide diagnostic and autism spectrum disorder-specific groups in a minimum of four counties for specific treatment services for persons who are not eligible for medicaid; and
