AN ACT

RELATING TO LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEES; CREATING THE OIL CONSERVATION DIVISION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. OIL CONSERVATION DIVISION OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE CREATED--TERMINATION.--The joint interim legislative "oil conservation division oversight committee" is created. The committee shall function from the date of its appointment until December 15, 2011.

Section 2. MEMBERSHIP--APPOINTMENT--VACANCIES.--

A. The oil conservation division oversight committee is composed of ten members. The New Mexico legislative council shall appoint five members from the house of representatives and five members from the senate and shall designate the chair and vice chair of the committee.

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1 Members shall be appointed from each house so as 2 to give the two major political parties in each house the same 3 proportionate representation on the committee as prevails in each house; however, in no event shall either party have less 5 than one member from each house on the committee. At the request of the committee chair, members may be removed from the 7 committee by the New Mexico legislative council for 8 nonattendance according to council policy. Vacancies on the 9 committee, however caused, may be filled by the council, or the 10 council may reduce the size of the committee by not making 11 replacement appointments and in that case need not readjust 12 party representation. 13

C. An action shall not be taken by the committee if a majority of the total membership from either house on the committee rejects that action.

Section 3. DUTIES.--

A. After its appointment, the oil conservation division oversight committee shall hold one organizational meeting to develop a work plan and budget for the ensuing interim. The work plan and budget shall be submitted to the New Mexico legislative council for approval. Upon approval of the work plan and budget by the council, the committee shall:

(1) examine the statutes, constitutional provisions and rules governing the oil conservation division of the energy, minerals and natural resources department;
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- (2) monitor and oversee the oil conservation division as it administers New Mexico's oil, gas and geothermal resources;
- review issues that affect the state's oil conservation, including emissions, oil extraction and compliance with federal statutes and policies; and
- (4) make recommendations to the legislature relating to the adoption of rules and for suggested legislation, if any are found to be necessary.
- The committee shall regularly receive testimony from the secretaries of energy, minerals and natural resources; economic development; and environment.

SUBCOMMITTEES.--Subcommittees shall be created Section 4. only by majority vote of all members appointed to the oil conservation division oversight committee and with the prior approval of the New Mexico legislative council. A subcommittee shall be composed of at least one member from the senate and one member from the house of representatives, and at least one member of the minority party shall be a member of the subcommittee. Any meeting or expenditure of a subcommittee shall be approved by the full committee in advance of that meeting or expenditure, and the approval shall be shown in the minutes of the committee.

Section 5. REPORTS.--The oil conservation division oversight committee shall make reports of its findings and .170718.1

recommendations for the consideration of the first and second sessions of the forty-ninth and fiftieth legislatures. The reports and suggested legislation shall be made available to the New Mexico legislative council on or before December 15 preceding each session.

Section 6. STAFF.--The staff for the oil conservation division oversight committee shall be provided primarily by the legislative council service, but the legislative council service may request the assistance of the legislative finance committee staff at the direction of the committee.

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
