AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL LAW; PROHIBITING INTIMIDATION OF A
CRIMINAL JUSTICE OFFICIAL; PROHIBITING RETALIATION; PROVIDING
PENALTIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Criminal Code is enacted
to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] INTIMIDATION OF A CRIMINAL JUSTICE
OFFICIAL--RETALIATION.--

A. Intimidation of a criminal justice official
consists of intimidating or threatening a criminal justice
official or a staff or family member of a criminal justice
official who is or may become involved in a judicial,
administrative, legislative or other official cause or
proceeding for the purpose of preventing or influencing a

1 judicial ruling, prosecution, investigation, testimony, report
2 or sentence.

3 B. Retaliation against a criminal justice official
4 consists of causing bodily injury to or damage to the property
5 of a criminal justice official or a staff or family member of a
6 criminal justice official, or threatening to do so, with the
7 intent to retaliate against the criminal justice official for a
8 judicial ruling, prosecution, investigation, testimony, report
9 or sentence.

10 C. A person who commits intimidation of a criminal
11 justice official is guilty of a third degree felony.

12 D. A person who commits retaliation against a
13 criminal justice official is guilty of a second degree felony.

14 E. As used in this section:

15 (1) "criminal justice official" means a judge,
16 a special commissioner, a hearing officer, a district attorney,
17 a deputy district attorney, an assistant district attorney, a
18 senior trial prosecutor, a chief public defender, a district
19 public defender, an assistant public defender, the attorney
20 general, a deputy attorney general, an assistant attorney
21 general, a law enforcement officer or a probation and parole
22 officer or an attorney if the intimidation or retaliation arose
23 out of that attorney's representation of a defendant in a
24 criminal action; and

25 (2) "family member" means a person who is a
