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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. APPROPRIATIONEMERGENCY DISASTER RELIEF
18	A. The legislature finds that, because of the
19	recent heavy snows and winds in Rio Arriba county and the
20	village of Chama and its surrounding communities:
21	(1) there are many elderly, sick and disabled
22	persons in several remote rural areas who are stranded and
23	cannot get out of their homes;
24	(2) there are many homes in rural areas
25	running out of propane because trucks cannot reach their homes

1 on the snow-packed roads; 2 there are thousands of cattle stranded and (3) 3 facing starvation; 4 the situation is of such magnitude that it (4) 5 is beyond the control of local governments; and 6 (5) state expenditures are necessary to 7 provide those resources and services necessary to avoid or 8 minimize economic or physical harm until the situation becomes 9 stabilized and again under local self-support and control. 10 Β. Three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) is 11 appropriated from the general fund to the local government 12 division of the department of finance and administration for 13 expenditure in fiscal years 2008 and 2009 to take any action 14 necessary to alleviate the emergency situation in Rio Arriba 15 county and the village of Chama and its surrounding 16 communities, including expenditures on a temporary, emergency 17 basis for lodging, sheltering, health care, food, snow removal 18 and any transportation or shipping necessary to protect lives 19 or public property or for any other action necessary to protect 20 the public health, safety and welfare as follows: 21 one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) (1)22 for the village of Chama and its surrounding communities; and 23 (2) two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) 24 for Rio Arriba county. 25

C. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance of the .172962.1 - 2 -

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appropriation in Subsection B of this section remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the general fund. Section 2. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately. - 3 -.172962.1

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
