SENATE BILL 165

48TH LEGISLATURE - STATE OF NEW MEXICO - SECOND SESSION, 2008

AN ACT

MAKING APPROPRIATIONS AND AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURES BY STATE  
AGENCIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. JUDICIAL PROJECTS.--The following amounts are appropriated from the general fund to the following agencies for expenditure in fiscal year 2009 for the purposes specified and, unless otherwise indicated, any unexpended or unencumbered balance of the appropriations remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the general fund:

1. to the administrative office of the courts, ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for the court-appointed attorney fund;

2. to the fifth judicial district court, twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for the drug court in Lea county;

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1           3. to the sixth judicial district, forty thousand  
2 dollars (\$40,000) for information systems personnel;

3           4. to the ninth judicial district court, thirty  
4 thousand dollars (\$30,000) to be divided equally between the  
5 Curry and Roosevelt county teen courts;

6           5. to the eleventh judicial district court, two  
7 hundred ten thousand dollars (\$210,000) for alternative  
8 sentencing and crime reduction programs;

9           6. to the twelfth judicial district court, ninety-  
10 seven thousand seven hundred dollars (\$97,700) for operational  
11 expenses;

12           7. to the thirteenth judicial district court, two  
13 hundred eleven thousand seven hundred dollars (\$211,700) for  
14 drug courts; and

15           8. to the third judicial district attorney, thirty-  
16 three thousand four hundred dollars (\$33,400) for animal  
17 shelter services for animals in protective custody in Dona Ana  
18 county.

19           Section 2. ATTORNEY GENERAL PROJECTS.--The following  
20 amounts are appropriated from the general fund to the office of  
21 the attorney general for expenditure in fiscal year 2009 for  
22 the purposes specified and, unless otherwise indicated, any  
23 unexpended or unencumbered balance of the appropriations  
24 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the  
25 general fund:

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1           1. forty-nine thousand nine hundred dollars  
2 (\$49,900) for the attorney general to pay costs associated with  
3 the enforcement of animal cruelty laws through the animal  
4 cruelty task force; and

5           2. eighty-two thousand dollars (\$82,000) for per  
6 diem and mileage expenses for public members of the task force  
7 to combat human trafficking, contingent on Senate Bill 71 of  
8 the second session of the forty-eighth legislature becoming  
9 law.

10           Section 3. DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION  
11 PROJECTS.--The following amounts are appropriated from the  
12 general fund to the department of finance and administration  
13 for expenditure in fiscal year 2009 for the purposes specified  
14 and, unless otherwise indicated, any unexpended or unencumbered  
15 balance of the appropriations remaining at the end of fiscal  
16 year 2009 shall revert to the general fund:

17           1. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for  
18 disbursement to the state housing authority for a statewide  
19 affordable housing study;

20           2. six thousand seven hundred dollars (\$6,700) for  
21 expenses associated with the citizen review board; and

22           3. for the mid-region council of governments,  
23 twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for a high-technology  
24 mentoring program at Robert F. Kennedy charter school in the  
25 Albuquerque public school district.

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1           Section 4. LOCAL GOVERNMENT DIVISION PROJECTS.--The  
2 following amounts are appropriated from the general fund to the  
3 local government division of the department of finance and  
4 administration for expenditure in fiscal year 2009 for the  
5 purposes specified and, unless otherwise indicated, any  
6 unexpended or unencumbered balance of the appropriations  
7 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the  
8 general fund:

9           1. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for a  
10 preventive health pilot program in rural areas of northwestern  
11 New Mexico that works to identify and improve the health of  
12 persons suffering from diabetes, heart disease, obesity or  
13 other preventable health conditions;

14           2. ninety-three thousand nine hundred dollars  
15 (\$93,900) to contract with a private entity in Bernalillo  
16 county to operate a secure, long-term, statewide  
17 multijurisdictional residential rehabilitation and transition  
18 facility that admits persons who have been ordered to the  
19 facility by a New Mexico court;

20           3. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for a  
21 transitional living program in Bernalillo county that offers  
22 temporary shelter, board, living skills education, behavioral  
23 health services and social services to homeless and runaway  
24 youth who are sixteen to twenty-one years old;

25           4. five thousand dollars (\$5,000) to provide free

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1 services consisting of cultural and arts programs to targeted  
2 areas of Bernalillo county;

3 5. five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for a bicycle  
4 repair and recycling program in the Atrisco area of the south  
5 valley in Bernalillo county;

6 6. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) to establish  
7 an emergency housing fund for homeless middle and high school  
8 students in Albuquerque;

9 7. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for a  
10 coalition between Grant county and the municipalities within  
11 the county's boundaries;

12 8. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to develop an  
13 after-prom and after-graduation anti-DWI program in Grant  
14 county;

15 9. twenty-three thousand dollars (\$23,000) for a  
16 domestic violence shelter operated by Lincoln county in Ruidoso  
17 Downs;

18 10. one hundred sixteen thousand seven hundred  
19 dollars (\$116,700) for operational expenses of Gallup,  
20 including an economic development director and a grant writer;

21 11. forty-one thousand seven hundred dollars  
22 (\$41,700) for programs to support healthy marriage and healthy  
23 family living for parents and their children in Rio Rancho;

24 12. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for salaries of  
25 the Mora county sheriff's office;

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1           13. eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000) for Mora  
2 county employees' salaries and operational expenses of Mora  
3 county;

4           14. fifteen thousand seven hundred dollars  
5 (\$15,700) for operational expenses for the Mora county  
6 attorney's office;

7           15. seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for a  
8 contract spay and neuter program in Sandoval county;

9           16. thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) for San  
10 Juan county for a medical affiliation program with the San Juan  
11 regional medical center and the university of New Mexico  
12 medical school;

13           17. fifty-five thousand dollars (\$55,000) for a  
14 staff position for a San Miguel county bureau of elections;

15           18. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for  
16 support staff for the San Miguel probate judge;

17           19. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for operational  
18 expenses of the fire department in Bernal in San Miguel county;

19           20. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for operational  
20 expenses of the fire department in Pecos in San Miguel county;

21           21. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for operational  
22 expenses of the fire department in Pueblo in San Miguel county;

23           22. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for recruitment  
24 of a medical provider for the Logan and Quay county health  
25 clinics;

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1           23. sixteen thousand seven hundred dollars  
2 (\$16,700) for an athlete and coach leadership training program  
3 for junior wrestling at Santa Fe high school in the Santa Fe  
4 public school district;

5           24. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for a community  
6 alcohol and drug recovery program in Santa Fe county;

7           25. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for a community  
8 drug and alcohol program in El Prado in Taos county;

9           26. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for  
10 community drug and alcohol programs in Talpa in Taos county;

11           27. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for  
12 operational expenses of the driving while intoxicated memorial  
13 of perpetual tears in Moriarty;

14           28. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for Espanola  
15 to clean, deodorize and sanitize commercial and residential  
16 refuse containers in compliance with federal clean water  
17 regulations;

18           29. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for Grants to  
19 clean, deodorize and sanitize commercial and residential refuse  
20 containers in compliance with federal clean water regulations;

21           30. five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for Questa to  
22 clean, deodorize and sanitize commercial and residential refuse  
23 containers in compliance with federal clean water regulations;

24           31. nineteen thousand dollars (\$19,000) for the  
25 city of Taos to clean, deodorize and sanitize commercial and

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1 residential refuse containers in compliance with federal clean  
2 water regulations;

3 32. eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000) for Los  
4 Ranchos de Albuquerque to implement the provisions of federal  
5 clean water regulations; and

6 33. twenty-two thousand five hundred dollars  
7 (\$22,500) for Tularosa to implement the provisions of federal  
8 clean water regulations.

9 Section 5. NEW MEXICO SENTENCING COMMISSION PROJECT.--Ten  
10 thousand dollars (\$10,000) is appropriated from the general  
11 fund to the New Mexico sentencing commission for expenditure in  
12 fiscal year 2009 to study, on a statewide basis, whether bias-  
13 based policing exists in New Mexico and, if so, the effects of  
14 that bias. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at  
15 the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the general fund.

16 Section 6. GOVERNOR'S OFFICE PROJECT.--Forty-one thousand  
17 seven hundred dollars (\$41,700) is appropriated from the  
18 general fund to the governor's office for expenditure in fiscal  
19 year 2009 to fund faith-based programs that support healthy  
20 marriage and healthy family living for parents and their  
21 children in Albuquerque and Bernalillo county. Any unexpended  
22 or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year  
23 2009 shall revert to the general fund.

24 Section 7. TOURISM DEPARTMENT PROJECT.--Fifteen thousand  
25 dollars (\$15,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the

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1 tourism department for expenditure in fiscal year 2009 to  
2 promote the arts, culture and sports unique to New Mexico's  
3 urban and rural communities. Any unexpended or unencumbered  
4 balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert  
5 to the general fund.

6 Section 8. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT PROJECTS.--The  
7 following amounts are appropriated from the general fund to the  
8 economic development department for expenditure in fiscal year  
9 2009 for the purposes specified and, unless otherwise  
10 indicated, any unexpended or unencumbered balance of the  
11 appropriations remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009 shall  
12 revert to the general fund:

13 1. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for Gallup to  
14 plan and administer its convention and visitors bureau,  
15 including promoting convention sales, convention services,  
16 tourism and events and other activities relating to economic  
17 development; and

18 2. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for economic  
19 development of the New Mexico wine industry.

20 Section 9. CULTURAL AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT PROJECTS.--The  
21 following amounts are appropriated from the general fund to the  
22 cultural affairs department for expenditure in fiscal year 2009  
23 for the purposes specified and, unless otherwise indicated, any  
24 unexpended or unencumbered balance of the appropriations  
25 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the

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1 general fund:

2 1. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for educational  
3 initiatives, information and marketing for the opening of the  
4 New Mexico history museum;

5 2. thirty-one thousand seven hundred dollars  
6 (\$31,700) for education programs at the national Hispanic  
7 cultural center;

8 3. sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) to the library  
9 division for grants-in-aid to rural libraries in Rio Arriba  
10 county, with each of six libraries receiving ten thousand  
11 dollars (\$10,000);

12 4. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to support a  
13 statewide education and outreach program for youth by a  
14 professional orchestra;

15 5. twenty-six thousand seven hundred dollars  
16 (\$26,700) to implement and operate a youth education program  
17 that includes art integration curriculum projects, outreach  
18 projects at schools, pueblos and community service  
19 organizations, as well as professional development for  
20 teachers;

21 6. sixteen thousand seven hundred dollars (\$16,700)  
22 for a film festival about the Native American perspective on  
23 the environment;

24 7. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to build  
25 electronic infrastructure and web sites for Native American

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1 artists and youth;

2 8. thirty-seven thousand five hundred dollars  
3 (\$37,500) to contract with a nonprofit music organization that  
4 organizes a competition in which children twelve years of age  
5 and under compete to hear their musical compositions performed  
6 in concert and recorded on compact disc;

7 9. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for cultural  
8 and arts programs and educational outreach in Bernalillo  
9 county;

10 10. five thousand dollars (\$5,000) to provide  
11 symphony music programs and concerts in Albuquerque;

12 11. forty-six thousand six hundred dollars  
13 (\$46,600) for education programs at a science center and  
14 children's museum in Albuquerque;

15 12. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to  
16 support cultural programming in the Chimayo area;

17 13. one hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$120,000)  
18 for staff and expenses associated with the development of a  
19 veterans' museum in Las Cruces; and

20 14. eighty thousand dollars (\$80,000) to provide  
21 symphony orchestra music programs and concerts in Roswell.

22 Section 10. STATE PARKS PROJECT.--Ten thousand dollars  
23 (\$10,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the state  
24 parks division of the energy, minerals and natural resources  
25 department for expenditure in fiscal year 2009 for an outdoor

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1 classroom program to serve the students of the Valley high  
2 school cluster of the Albuquerque public schools. Any  
3 unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of  
4 fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the general fund.

5 Section 11. COMMISSION FOR THE BLIND PROJECT.--Twenty-  
6 five thousand dollars (\$25,000) is appropriated from the  
7 general fund to the commission for the blind for expenditure in  
8 fiscal year 2009 for positions to provide rehabilitation  
9 training. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at  
10 the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the general fund.

11 Section 12. INDIAN AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT PROJECTS.--The  
12 following amounts are appropriated from the general fund to the  
13 Indian affairs department for expenditure in fiscal year 2009  
14 for the purposes specified and, unless otherwise indicated, any  
15 unexpended or unencumbered balance of the appropriations  
16 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the  
17 general fund:

18 1. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for an American  
19 Indian organization with over thirty years' experience in  
20 Indian law and policy to assist tribes to develop tribal court  
21 systems and promote Indian law and policy development and  
22 training;

23 2. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for increased  
24 economic development activities for the state's American Indian  
25 nations, tribes and pueblos; and

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1           3. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for a summer  
2 youth conservation program in Navajo Nation chapters in the  
3 eastern Navajo agency.

4           Section 13. AGING AND LONG-TERM SERVICES DEPARTMENT  
5 PROJECTS.--The following amounts are appropriated from the  
6 general fund to the aging and long-term services department for  
7 expenditure in fiscal year 2009 for the purposes specified and,  
8 unless otherwise indicated, any unexpended or unencumbered  
9 balance of the appropriations remaining at the end of fiscal  
10 year 2009 shall revert to the general fund:

11           1. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to assist  
12 persons with brain injuries to receive social, vocational and  
13 educational support; and

14           2. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to provide  
15 assistance, transportation, organized activities and other  
16 services for Eddy county senior citizen centers.

17           Section 14. GOVERNOR'S COMMISSION ON DISABILITY  
18 PROJECT.--Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) is appropriated from  
19 the general fund to the governor's commission on disability for  
20 expenditure in fiscal year 2009 for operational support of the  
21 community outreach program for the deaf. Any unexpended or  
22 unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009  
23 shall revert to the general fund.

24           Section 15. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH PROJECTS.--The following  
25 amounts are appropriated from the general fund to the

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1 department of health for expenditure in fiscal year 2009 for  
2 the purposes specified and, unless otherwise indicated, any  
3 unexpended or unencumbered balance of the appropriations  
4 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the  
5 general fund:

6 1. thirty-three thousand two hundred dollars  
7 (\$33,200) to conduct environmental assessments of public  
8 schools pursuant to the indoor air quality tools for schools  
9 program;

10 2. eighty-five thousand six hundred dollars  
11 (\$85,600) to support the twenty-four-hour nurse advice line;

12 3. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to establish a  
13 cardiovascular disease prevention program;

14 4. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to establish a  
15 healthy New Mexico task force and develop and implement a  
16 strategic plan to prevent and manage chronic diseases;

17 5. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) to develop a  
18 pilot project to provide special needs children a place to  
19 develop skills through horseback riding;

20 6. fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) for a  
21 residential summer camp for children with autism spectrum  
22 disorder;

23 7. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for services  
24 for veterans exposed to uranium;

25 8. thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000) for rape

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1 crisis services in central New Mexico;

2 9. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to provide  
3 services to indigent cancer patients in Chaves, Eddy, Lea and  
4 Lincoln counties, including home health services, medications  
5 and transportation;

6 10. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for the first  
7 step pre- and perinatal clinic to provide services, including  
8 prenatal, delivery and postnatal services, for uninsured low-  
9 income pregnant women with high-risk conditions in Dona Ana  
10 county;

11 11. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for a  
12 regional treatment center for alcohol and substance abuse in  
13 Eddy county;

14 12. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for  
15 telehealth psychiatry conferencing and clinical consultation  
16 programs serving children, families and health care providers  
17 in Eddy county;

18 13. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for a northern  
19 New Mexico traditional healing training program for substance  
20 abuse treatment in Rio Arriba county; and

21 14. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for  
22 operational support for women's health services in Santa Fe.

23 Section 16. DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT PROJECT.--Twenty-  
24 five thousand dollars (\$25,000) is appropriated from the  
25 general fund to the department of environment for expenditure

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1 in fiscal year 2009 for a Ruidoso river restoration committee  
2 to determine the most effective means of controlling phosphorus  
3 and nitrogen in the Ruidoso river. Any unexpended or  
4 unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009  
5 shall revert to the general fund.

6 Section 17. VETERANS' SERVICES DEPARTMENT PROJECTS.--The  
7 following amounts are appropriated from the general fund to the  
8 veterans' services department for expenditure in fiscal year  
9 2009 for the purposes specified and, unless otherwise  
10 indicated, any unexpended or unencumbered balance of the  
11 appropriations remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009 shall  
12 revert to the general fund:

- 13 1. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for  
14 integrative services for needy veterans; and
- 15 2. sixteen thousand seven hundred dollars (\$16,700)  
16 for outreach programs for homeless veterans.

17 Section 18. CHILDREN, YOUTH AND FAMILIES DEPARTMENT  
18 PROJECTS.--The following amounts are appropriated from the  
19 general fund to the children, youth and families department for  
20 expenditure in fiscal year 2009 for the purposes specified and,  
21 unless otherwise indicated, any unexpended or unencumbered  
22 balance of the appropriations remaining at the end of fiscal  
23 year 2009 shall revert to the general fund:

- 24 1. thirty-six thousand seven hundred dollars  
25 (\$36,700) to provide children and families with access to a

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1 best-practices, character-building youth dance program offered  
2 in partnership with local school districts;

3 2. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to provide  
4 children and families with access to a best-practices,  
5 character-building youth dance program offered in partnership  
6 with local school districts in Colfax and Union counties;

7 3. three thousand seven hundred dollars (\$3,700)  
8 for a youth dance program in Capitan to be conducted in  
9 partnership with a local school district;

10 4. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for domestic  
11 violence programs in Eddy and Otero counties;

12 5. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for learning  
13 enrichment programs for youth exiting detention facilities in  
14 Dona Ana county;

15 6. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for the jardin  
16 de los ninos program in Dona Ana county;

17 7. forty-eight thousand one hundred seventy dollars  
18 (\$48,170) for the no child left inside program in Santa Fe; and

19 8. sixteen thousand seven hundred dollars (\$16,700)  
20 for transitional living services for homeless, abused and  
21 neglected youth in Taos county.

22 Section 19. DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AFFAIRS PROJECT.--  
23 Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) is appropriated from the  
24 general fund to the department of military affairs for  
25 expenditure in fiscal year 2009 to provide New Mexico active

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1 duty military personnel in Iraq and Afghanistan with military  
2 equipment. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at  
3 the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the general fund.

4 Section 20. PUBLIC EDUCATION DEPARTMENT PROJECTS.--The  
5 following amounts are appropriated from the general fund to the  
6 public education department for expenditure in fiscal year 2009  
7 for the purposes specified and, unless otherwise indicated, any  
8 unexpended or unencumbered balance of the appropriations  
9 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the  
10 general fund:

11 1. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for  
12 professional development in social studies and civics  
13 statewide;

14 2. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for education of  
15 middle and high school students in the use of advanced  
16 computers;

17 3. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for  
18 professional judgment of educators in the La Cueva and Eldorado  
19 clusters of the Albuquerque public school district;

20 4. twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for students  
21 and families to participate in a best-practice, character-  
22 building youth dance program at Mission Avenue elementary  
23 school in the Albuquerque public school district;

24 5. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for a job  
25 program at Nuestros Valores charter school in the Albuquerque

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1 public school district;

2 6. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for student and  
3 faculty training at the Moreno Valley charter high school in  
4 the Cimarron municipal school district;

5 7. seven thousand dollars (\$7,000) for a parent  
6 conference and outreach activity for special needs children in  
7 the Gadsden independent school district;

8 8. ninety-four thousand seven hundred dollars  
9 (\$94,700) to establish and support the activities of a  
10 districtwide student discipline advisory council in the Gadsden  
11 independent school district;

12 9. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the  
13 promise for success program in the Gadsden independent school  
14 district;

15 10. five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for the Los  
16 Lunas high school reform and college readiness project,  
17 including academic coaches, smaller learning communities and  
18 professional development through summer institutes;

19 11. sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) for an  
20 extended day program in the Santa Fe public school district;

21 12. ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for music and  
22 athletic programs at Valley middle school in the west Las Vegas  
23 school district; and

24 13. thirteen thousand four hundred dollars  
25 (\$13,400) for trophies, medals and printing costs for a

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1 statewide activities association.

2 Section 21. HIGHER EDUCATION DEPARTMENT PROJECTS.--The  
3 following amounts are appropriated from the general fund to the  
4 higher education department for expenditure in fiscal year 2009  
5 for the purposes specified and, unless otherwise indicated, any  
6 unexpended or unencumbered balance of the appropriations  
7 remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the  
8 general fund:

9 1. for the department, sixty thousand dollars  
10 (\$60,000) to continue the task force on cultural competence in  
11 health education;

12 2. for Luna community college, fifteen thousand  
13 dollars (\$15,000) for bridge scholarships;

14 3. for Mesalands community college, twenty-five  
15 thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the intercollegiate rodeo  
16 program;

17 4. for New Mexico junior college, one hundred  
18 forty-one thousand six hundred dollars (\$141,600) for  
19 intercollegiate athletics; and
