17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	Section 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
19	"Polysomnography Practice Act".
20	Section 2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Polysomnography
21	Practice Act:
22	A. "board" means the polysomnography practice
23	board;
24	B. "department" means the regulation and licensing
25	department;
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1 С. "direct supervision" means that the 2 polysomnographic technologist providing supervision shall be 3 present in the area where the polysomnographic procedure is 4 being performed and immediately available to furnish assistance 5 and direction throughout the performance of the procedure; "fund" means the polysomnography fund; 6 D. 7 Ε. "general supervision" means that the 8 polysomnographic procedure is provided under a physician's 9 overall direction and control, but the physician's presence is 10 not required during the performance of the procedure; 11 F. "license" means an authorization issued by the 12 board that permits a person to engage in the practice of 13 polysomnography in the state; 14 G. "licensee" means a person licensed by the board 15 to engage in the practice of polysomnography; 16 "polysomnographic student" means a person who is н. 17 enrolled in an educational program that is accredited by the 18 commission on accreditation of allied health education 19 programs, as provided in Section 4 of the Polysomnography 20 Practice Act, and who may provide sleep-related services under 21 the direct supervision of a polysomnographic technologist as a 22 part of the person's educational program; 23 "polysomnographic technician" means a person who I. 24 has graduated from an accredited educational program described 25 in Section 4 of the Polysomnography Practice Act but has not

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J. "polysomnographic technologist" means a person who is credentialed by the board of registered polysomnographic technologists and is licensed by the board to engage in the practice of polysomnography under the general supervision of a licensed physician;

K. "polysomnographic trainee" means a person who is enrolled in an accredited sleep technologist educational program that is accredited by the American academy of sleep medicine and who may provide sleep-related services under the direct supervision of a polysomnographic technologist as a part of the person's educational program;

L. "practice of polysomnography" means the performance of diagnostic and therapeutic tasks, under the general supervision of a licensed physician, including:

(1) monitoring and recording physiologic activity and data during the evaluation or treatment of sleep-related disorders, including sleep-related respiratory disturbances, by applying appropriate techniques, equipment and procedures, including:

(a) continuous or bi-level positive

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1 airway pressure titration on patients using a nasal or oral or 2 a nasal and oral mask or appliance that does not extend into 3 the trachea or attach to an artificial airway, including the 4 fitting and selection of a mask or appliance and the selection 5 and implementation of treatment settings; 6 (b) supplemental low-flow oxygen therapy 7 that is less than ten liters per minute using nasal cannula or 8 continuous or bi-level positive airway pressure during a 9 polysomnogram; 10 (c) capnography during a polysomnogram; 11 (d) cardiopulmonary resuscitation; 12 (e) pulse oximetry; 13 (f) gastroesophageal pH monitoring; 14 esophageal pressure monitoring; (g) 15 sleep staging, including surface (h) 16 electroencephalography, surface electrooculography and surface 17 submental electromyography; 18 (i) surface electromyography; 19 (j) electrocardiography; 20 respiratory effort monitoring, (k) 21 including thoracic and abdominal movement; 22 respiratory plethysmography; (1)23 arterial tonometry and additional (m) 24 measures of autonomic nervous system tone; 25 (n) snore monitoring; .171010.2 - 4 -

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1	(o) audio or video monitoring;
2	(p) body movement monitoring;
3	(q) nocturnal penile tumescence
4	monitoring;
5	(r) nasal and oral airflow monitoring;
6	(s) body temperature monitoring; and
7	(t) use of additional sleep-related
8	diagnostic technologies as determined by a rule adopted by the
9	board;
10	(2) observing and monitoring physical signs
11	and symptoms, general behavior and general physical response to
12	polysomnographic evaluation or treatment and determining
13	whether initiation, modification or discontinuation of a
14	treatment regimen is warranted;
15	(3) analyzing and scoring data collected
16	during the monitoring described in Paragraphs (1) and (2) of
17	this subsection for the purpose of assisting a licensed
18	physician in the diagnosis and treatment of sleep and wake
19	disorders that result from developmental defects, the aging
20	process, physical injury, disease or actual or anticipated
21	somatic dysfunction;
22	(4) implementing a written or verbal order
23	from a licensed physician that requires the practice of
24	polysomnography;
25	(5) educating a patient regarding the
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treatment regimen that assists that patient in improving the 2 patient's sleep; and

initiating and monitoring treatment, under (6) the orders of a licensed physician, for sleep-related breathing disorders by providing continuous positive airway pressure and bi-level positive airway pressure devices and accessories, including masks that do not extend into the trachea or attach to an artificial airway, to a patient for home use, together with educating the patient about the treatment and managing the treatment;

М. "sleep-related services" means acts performed by polysomnographic technicians, polysomnographic trainees, polysomnographic students and other persons permitted to perform these services under the Polysomnography Practice Act, in a setting described in Subsection F of Section 3 of the Polysomnography Practice Act, that would be considered the practice of polysomnography if performed by a polysomnographic technologist; and

"superintendent" means the superintendent of N. regulation and licensing.

Section 3. LICENSE REQUIRED--EXCEPTIONS--PRACTICE LIMITATIONS--APPLICABILITY.--

On and after July 1, 2011, a person who is Α. engaged in the practice of polysomnography must have a valid polysomnographic technologist license issued by the board. It .171010.2 - 6 -

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shall be unlawful for a person to engage in the practice of polysomnography after that date unless the person has a valid polysomnographic technologist license issued by the board.

B. Prior to July 1, 2011, any person who is engaged in the practice of polysomnography without being licensed under the Polysomnography Practice Act shall not be deemed to be in violation of that act.

C. The following classes of persons may provide sleep-related services without being licensed as a polysomnographic technologist:

(1) a polysomnographic technician under the general supervision of a licensed physician for a period of up to two years from the date of the person's graduation from one of the accredited programs described in Section 4 of the Polysomnography Practice Act; provided that the board may grant a one-time extension of up to one year beyond the original twoyear period;

(2) a polysomnographic trainee who may provide sleep-related services under the direct supervision of a polysomnographic technologist as a part of the trainee's educational program while actively enrolled in an accredited sleep technologist educational program that is accredited by the American academy of sleep medicine;

(3) a polysomnographic student who may provide uncompensated sleep-related services under the direct

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supervision of a polysomnographic technologist as a part of the student's educational program while actively enrolled in a polysomnographic educational program that is accredited by the commission on accreditation of allied health education programs;

(4) a person credentialed in one of the health-related fields accepted by the board of registered polysomnographic technologists who may provide sleep-related services under the direct supervision of a polysomnographic technologist for a period of up to one year while obtaining the clinical experience necessary to be eligible to take the examination given by the board of registered polysomnographic technologists; and

(5) a respiratory care practitioner licensed under the Respiratory Care Act who may provide sleep-related services under the general supervision of a licensed physician if the licensed respiratory care practitioner is credentialed by the board of registered polysomnographic technologists. Respiratory care practitioners in this class are subject to disciplinary action pursuant to the Respiratory Care Act if they fail to adhere to the standards established in the Polysomnography Practice Act and rules adopted pursuant to that act.

D. Before providing any sleep-related services:(1) a polysomnographic technician shall obtain

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a temporary permit from the board and when providing services shall wear a badge that appropriately identifies the person as a polysomnographic technician;

4 (2) a polysomnographic trainee shall give
5 notice to the board that the trainee is enrolled in an
6 accredited sleep technologist educational program accredited by
7 the American academy of sleep medicine. When providing
8 services, the trainee shall wear a badge that appropriately
9 identifies the person as a polysomnographic trainee;

(3) a person who is obtaining clinical experience pursuant to Paragraph (4) of Subsection C of this section shall give notice to the board that the person is working under the direct supervision of a polysomnographic technologist in order to gain the experience to be eligible to take the examination given by the board of registered polysomnographic technologists. When providing services, the person shall wear a badge that appropriately identifies that the person is obtaining clinical experience; and

(4) a polysomnographic student shall wear a badge that appropriately identifies the person as a polysomnographic student.

E. A licensed dentist shall make or direct the making and use of any oral appliance used in the practice of polysomnography and shall evaluate the structures of a patient's oral and maxillofacial region for purposes of fitting .171010.2

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1 the appliance.

2	F. The practice of polysomnography shall take place
3	only in a hospital, a stand-alone sleep laboratory or sleep
4	center or in a patient's home in accordance with a physician's
5	order; provided that the scoring of data and the education of
6	patients may take place in settings other than in a hospital,
7	sleep laboratory, sleep center or patient's home.
8	G. The Polysomnography Practice Act does not apply
9	to:
10	(1) diagnostic electroencephalograms conducted
11	in accordance with the guidelines of the American clinical
12	neurophysiology society;
13	(2) a person who is employed in the practice
14	of polysomnography by a federal government facility or agency
15	in New Mexico; or
16	(3) a person qualified as a member of a
17	recognized profession, the practice of which requires a license
18	or is regulated pursuant to the laws of New Mexico, who renders
19	services within the scope of the person's license or other
20	regulatory authority; provided that the person does not
21	represent that the person is a polysomnographic technologist.
22	Section 4. EDUCATIONPROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS
23	A. The board may issue a polysomnographic
24	technologist license to a person if that person:
25	(1) is at least eighteen years of age;
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1 (2) meets one of the following educational 2 requirements: 3 (a) graduation from a polysomnographic 4 educational program that is accredited by the commission on 5 accreditation of allied health education programs; 6 (b) graduation from a respiratory care 7 educational program that is accredited by the commission on 8 accreditation of allied health education programs and 9 completion of the curriculum for a polysomnography certificate 10 established and accredited by the committee on accreditation 11 for respiratory care of the commission on accreditation of 12 allied health education programs; 13 (c) graduation from an 14 electroneurodiagnostic technologist educational program with a 15 polysomnographic technology track that is accredited by the 16 commission on accreditation of allied health education 17 programs; or 18 (d) successful completion of an 19 accredited sleep technologist educational program that is 20 accredited by the American academy of sleep medicine; provided, 21 however, this optional requirement shall not be available after 22 the date on which there are at least three polysomnographic 23 technologist educational programs in New Mexico that have been 24 accredited by the commission on accreditation of allied health 25 education programs for at least the two years immediately .171010.2

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1 preceding that date;

(3) has passed the national certifying
examination given by the board of registered polysomnographic
technologists or has passed a national certifying examination
equivalent to the board of registered polysomnographic
technologists' examination as determined by a rule adopted by
the polysomnography practice board;

8 (4) has been credentialed by the board of
9 registered polysomnographic technologists or by another
10 national entity equivalent to the board of polysomnographic
11 technologists as determined by rule adopted by the
12 polysomnography practice board;

(5) has met any additional educational or clinical requirements established by the board pursuant to rule; and

(6) has met all other requirements of the Polysomnography Practice Act.

B. A person who is engaged in the practice of polysomnography on July 1, 2008 shall be eligible for a license under the Polysomnography Practice Act without meeting the educational requirement of Paragraph (2) of Subsection A of this section, provided that the person meets the requirements of Paragraphs (3) through (6) of Subsection A of this section.

C. The board may require a personal interview with an applicant to evaluate that person's qualifications for a .171010.2 - 12 -

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1 license. 2 Section 5. APPLICATION .--3 An applicant for a license shall: Α. 4 (1) complete and submit an application on a 5 form furnished by the board; and 6 (2) provide all of the information requested 7 by the board. 8 An applicant shall submit a nonrefundable Β. 9 application fee with the application. 10 Section 6. LICENSE--CONTENTS--DISPLAY--FEES--RENEWAL.--11 A. A license issued by the board shall contain the 12 name of the person to whom it is issued, the address of the 13 person, the date and number of the license and other 14 information the board may require. The address contained on 15 the license shall be the address where all correspondence and 16 renewal forms from the board will be sent. Any person whose 17 address changes shall, within thirty days of the change, notify 18 the board of the address change. The most recent address 19 contained in the board's records for each license holder is the 20 address deemed sufficient for purposes of service of process. 21 A license holder who wishes to retire from the Β. 22 practice of polysomnography shall file with the board an 23 affidavit, in a form to be furnished by the board, stating the 24 date on which the person retired from practice and other 25 information the board may require. If that person wishes to .171010.2

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1 reenter the practice of polysomnography, the person shall meet 2 requirements established by the board for license renewal. C. A license holder shall display the license in 3 4 the office or place in which the license holder practices in a 5 location clearly visible to patients. The board shall establish license and 6 D. 7 administrative fees, but no individual fee shall exceed one 8 thousand dollars (\$1,000). 9 Ε. The board shall review licenses for renewal 10 annually, and all licenses to be renewed shall be renewed on 11 July 1. Applicants for license renewal shall submit: 12 a renewal application on a form provided (1) 13 by the board; 14 a license renewal fee; (2) 15 proof that the applicant continues to be (3) 16 credentialed by the board of registered polysomnographic 17 technologists; and 18 (4) proof of completion of continuing 19 education requirements. 20 Section 7. BOARD--CREATION--ORGANIZATION--PER DIEM AND 21 MILEAGE -- REMOVAL --22 The "polysomnography practice board" is created Α. 23 and is administratively attached to the department. 24 The board shall have the following seven Β. 25 members, who are residents of New Mexico, appointed by the .171010.2 - 14 -

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1 governor: 2 (1)three members who are credentialed by the 3 board of registered polysomnographic technologists; provided 4 that when the polysomnography practice board begins issuing 5 licenses, this category of board members shall be three licensed polysomnographic technologists, with the then-sitting 6 7 members in this category being given a reasonable amount of 8 time to become licensed; 9 one licensed physician who is certified in (2) 10 sleep medicine by a national certifying body recognized by the 11 American academy of sleep medicine; 12 one person who is the director of an (3) 13 American-academy-of-sleep-medicine-accredited sleep center; 14 (4) one licensed respiratory care practitioner 15 who is also credentialed by the board of registered 16 polysomnographic technologists who shall be required to become 17 a licensed polysomnographic technologist within a reasonable 18 amount of time; and 19 (5) one member of the public who is not 20 economically or professionally associated with the health care 21 field. 22 Term-length conditions for appointments to the C. 23 board are: 24 for initial appointments, two members each (1) 25 for four-year, three-year and two-year terms and one member for .171010.2

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1 a one-year term;

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(2) for regular appointments after the initial 3 appointments, four-year terms;

4 for a vacancy appointment, the balance of (3) 5 the term; and

for any one member, no more than two 6 (4) 7 terms, including an initial appointment term; provided that a 8 member shall continue to serve on the board until a replacement 9 is appointed.

10 The board shall elect annually a chairperson and D. 11 other officers as the board determines to be necessary.

Ε. The board shall meet at least twice per calendar year and otherwise as often as necessary to conduct business, with four members constituting a quorum and meetings subject to the Open Meetings Act.

The department shall reimburse members of the F. board as nonsalaried public officers pursuant to the Per Diem and Mileage Act, and members shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance for their service on the board.

The governor may remove from office a member of G. the board for neglect of duties required by the Polysomnography Practice Act, malfeasance in office, incompetence or unprofessional conduct.

Section 8. BOARD--POWERS AND DUTIES.--

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1 The board shall have powers regarding licensing Α. 2 of polysomnographic technologists, temporary permitting of 3 polysomnographic technicians, approval of polysomnography curricula, approval of degree programs in polysomnography and 4 5 any other matters that are necessary to ensure the training and licensing of competent polysomnographic technologists. 6 7 Β. The board shall hold hearings and adopt rules 8 regarding: 9 (1)the licensing of polysomnographic 10 technologists, the practice of polysomnography and the minimum 11 qualifications and hours of clinical experience and standards 12 of care required for being licensed as a polysomnographic 13 technologist; 14 criteria for continuing education (2) 15 requirements; 16 (3) the manner in which records of 17 examinations and treatments shall be kept and maintained; 18 (4) professional conduct, ethics and 19 responsibility; 20 disciplinary actions, including the (5) 21 denial, suspension or revocation of or the imposition of 22 restrictions or conditions on a license, and the circumstances 23 that require disciplinary action; 24 (6) a means to provide information to all 25 polysomnographic technologists licensed in the state; .171010.2 - 17 -

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1 the inspection of the business premises of (7) 2 a licensee when the board determines that an inspection is 3 necessary; 4 the investigation of complaints against (8) 5 licensees or persons holding themselves out as engaging in the practice of polysomnography in the state; 6 7 the publication of information for the (9) 8 public about licensees and the practice of polysomnography in 9 the state; 10 an orderly process for reinstatement of a (10)11 license; 12 criteria for acceptance of (11)13 polysomnography credentials or licenses issued in other 14 jurisdictions; 15 (12) criteria for advertising or promotional 16 materials; and 17 any matter necessary to implement the (13) 18 Polysomnography Practice Act. 19 Section 9. POLYSOMNOGRAPHY FUND CREATED--USE--20 APPROPRIATION. --21 The "polysomnography fund" is created in the Α. 22 state treasury. 23 All fees collected pursuant to the provisions of Β. 24 the Polysomnography Practice Act shall be deposited with the 25 state treasurer. The state treasurer shall place the money to .171010.2 - 18 -

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1 the credit of the fund.

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3 department to carry out the provisions of the Polysomnography 4 Practice Act. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining 5 in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund. Expenditures shall be made from the fund on 6 7 warrants drawn by the secretary of finance and administration 8 pursuant to vouchers signed by the superintendent. 9 Section 10. ADMINISTRATIVE HEARINGS.--Administrative 10 hearings shall be conducted pursuant to the Uniform Licensing 11 Act. 12 Section 11. OFFENSES--CRIMINAL PENALTIES.--A person who 13 engages in the practice of polysomnography without a license is 14 guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be sentenced in accordance 15 with the provisions of Section 31-19-1 NMSA 1978. 16 Section 12. VIOLATION--CIVIL PENALTIES.--The 17 superintendent may fine any person who intentionally violates 18 the provisions of the Polysomnography Practice Act a sum up to 19 one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or may suspend or revoke a 20 licensee's authority to engage in the practice of 21 polysomnography in New Mexico. 22 TERMINATION OF AGENCY LIFE--DELAYED REPEAL.--Section 13. 23 The polysomnography practice board is terminated on July 1, 24 2015 pursuant to the Sunset Act. The board shall continue to 25 operate according to the Polysomnography Practice Act until
