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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. Section 66-3-16 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1978,
17	Chapter 35, Section 36, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"66-3-16. DISTINCTIVE REGISTRATION PLATESPERSONS WITH
19	SIGNIFICANT MOBILITY LIMITATIONPARKING PLACARD
20	A. The division shall issue permanent distinctive
21	registration plates for use on motor vehicles and motorcycles
22	owned by a person with a significant mobility limitation [who
23	requests a distinctive registration plate and who proves
24	satisfactorily to the division that the person meets the
25	standard provided in Subsection I of this section. No fee in
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1	addition to the] as defined in Subsection K of this section,
2	who makes a written application for issuance of the plates,
3	accompanied by a medical statement from a licensed physician
4	attesting to the permanent significant mobility limitation. A
5	<u>one-time fee of one hundred dollars (\$100) shall be collected</u>
6	for issuance of each plate, but no other fee, including a
7	regular registration fee, if any, applicable to the motor
8	vehicle or motorcycle shall be collected for issuance of
9	distinctive registration plates pursuant to this section.
10	B. The revenue from the fee for each distinctive
11	registration plate issued pursuant to Subsection A of this
12	section shall be distributed as follows:
13	(1) twenty dollars (\$20.00) shall be retained
14	by the department and is appropriated to the department to
15	defray the costs of making and issuing the distinctive plates;
16	and
17	(2) eighty dollars (\$80.00) shall be
18	distributed to the disability fund and is appropriated to the
19	governor's commission on disability to further the purposes of
20	Sections 28-10-1 through 28-10-8.1 NMSA 1978.
21	$[B_{\bullet}]$ <u>C.</u> No person shall falsely claim to have a
22	significant mobility limitation so as to be eligible to be
23	issued a distinctive registration plate or a parking placard
24	pursuant to this section when the person does not in fact have
25	a significant mobility limitation. Upon notice and opportunity
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1 to be heard, the division may revoke and demand return of any 2 placard when: 3 (1)it was issued in error or with false 4 information; 5 the person receiving the placard is no (2) 6 longer eligible; or 7 the placard is being used by ineligible (3) 8 persons. 9 [C.] D. Upon written application to the division 10 accompanied by a medical statement by a licensed physician attesting to the permanent significant mobility limitation, a 11 12 resident of the state who has a significant mobility 13 limitation, as provided in this section, may apply for and be 14 issued no more than two parking placards for display upon a 15 motor vehicle registered to the person or motor vehicle owned 16 by another person who is transporting the person with a 17 significant mobility limitation. The physician shall provide 18 the division all information and records necessary to issue a 19 permanent parking placard. Once approved for use of a 20 permanent parking placard, a person with a significant mobility 21 limitation shall not be required to furnish further medical 22 information. 23 [D.] E. A parking placard issued pursuant to this 24 section shall expire on the same date the person's license or

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identification card issued pursuant to Section 66-5-401 NMSA

1978 expires.

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2 [E.] F. The division shall issue two-sided hanger-style parking placards with the following 3 4 characteristics: 5 a picture of the international symbol of (1)6 access; 7 a hologram to make duplication difficult; (2) 8 an imprinted expiration date; and (3) 9 a full-face photograph of the holder on (4) 10 the inside of the placard covered by a flap. 11 $[F_{\cdot}]$ G. The division shall consult with the 12 governor's commission on disability for continued issuance and 13 format of the placard. 14 [G.] H. The division may issue an identification 15 card containing a full-face photograph of the holder of the 16 registration plate or parking placard and the number of the 17 registration plate or parking placard issued to that person. 18 [H.] I. Upon written application to the division 19 accompanied by a medical statement from a licensed physician 20 attesting to a temporary significant mobility limitation, a 21 person may be issued a temporary placard for no more than one 22 year. The physician shall provide the division all information 23 and records necessary to issue a temporary placard. 24 [1.] J. Registration plates or parking placards 25 issued to a person with a significant mobility limitation by .172564.1

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1 another state or foreign jurisdiction shall be honored until 2 the motor vehicle or motorcycle is registered or the parking 3 placard holder establishes residency in this state. 4 [J.] K. A person with a significant mobility 5 limitation means a person who: cannot walk one hundred feet without 6 (1)7 stopping to rest; 8 cannot walk without the use of a brace, (2) 9 cane or crutch or without assistance from another person, a 10 prosthetic device, a wheelchair or other assistive device; 11 (3) is restricted by lung disease to such an 12 extent that the person's forced respiratory volume, when 13 exhaling for one second, when measured by spirometry, is less 14 than one liter or the arterial oxygen tension is less than 15 sixty millimeters on room air at rest; 16 uses portable oxygen; (4) 17 (5) has a severe cardiac condition; or 18 (6) is so severely limited in the ability to 19 walk due to an arthritic, neurologic or orthopedic condition 20 that the person cannot ascend or descend more than ten stair 21 steps." 22 - 5 -23 24 25 .172564.1

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
