RELATING TO THE COMMISSION FOR THE PROMOTION OF UNIFORMITY OF
LEGISLATION IN THE UNITED STATES; AMENDING THE DUTIES AND
REPORTING REQUIREMENTS OF THE COMMISSION TO INCLUDE
CONSIDERATION OF MODEL REGULATORY PROCESS LEGISLATION; ADDING A
MEMBER TO THE COMMISSION; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION; DECLARING AN
EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 2-4-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1967, Chapter 234, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:

"2-4-1. COMMISSION FOR THE PROMOTION OF UNIFORMITY OF LEGISLATION IN THE UNITED STATES.--

 \underline{A} . There is created a "commission for the promotion of uniformity of legislation in the United States". Its membership shall consist of:

16	Section 2. Section 2-4-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1917,
17	Chapter 77, Section 2) is amended to read:
18	"2-4-2. <u>DUTIES OF COMMISSIONERS</u> It [shall be] <u>is</u> the
19	duty of [said] <u>the</u> commissioners <u>for the promotion of</u>
20	uniformity of legislation in the United States:
21	$\underline{\mathtt{A.}}$ to examine the subjects of marriage, divorce and

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such uniformity of legislation on all subjects [which] that they deem desirable; and

B. to study model administrative procedure acts and regulatory process legislation and make recommendations pursuant to Section 2-4-3 NMSA 1978."

Section 3. Section 2-4-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1917, Chapter 77, Section 4) is amended to read:

"2-4-3. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE. -- [Said commissioner] The commissioners for the promotion of uniformity of legislation in the United States shall report to the legislature [from time to time, giving on or before November 1 of each year to detail the result of their investigations and [making such] make recommendations with respect to the adoption of uniform or model legislation, as they may deem proper."

Section 4. APPROPRIATION. -- One hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the legislative council service for expenditure in fiscal years 2008 and 2009 to facilitate the review of model administrative procedure acts and regulatory process legislation by the commission for the promotion of uniformity of legislation in the United States. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2009 shall revert to the general fund.
