RELATING TO THE LEGISLATIVE BRANCH; ALLOWING LEGISLATIVE REIMBURSEMENT FOR PARKING EXPENSES WHEN TRAVELING OUT-OF-STATE.

AN ACT

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. Section 2-1-9 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1971, Chapter 1, Section 11, as amended) is amended to read:

"2-1-9. OUT-OF-STATE TRAVEL--IN-STATE TRAVEL.--

A. Out-of-state travel of members, officers and employees of the legislative branch of government shall be exempt from approval by any member of the executive branch.

- B. Members of the legislature serving on official business for interim committees within the state shall receive:
- (1) per diem at the internal revenue service per diem rate as provided in Section 2-1-8 NMSA 1978 for each day served, including travel time, and the cost of public transportation by the shortest, most direct route or mileage for each mile traveled by the shortest, most direct route by automobiles at the internal revenue service standard mileage rate or by privately owned aircraft at the air mileage rate set out by the rules adopted by the department of finance and administration pursuant to the Per Diem and Mileage Act; and
 - (2) per diem for one additional day at the

2	2-1-8 NMSA 1978 if, in order to serve on official business
3	for an interim committee, a legislator travels to a location
4	that is one hundred or more miles from the location of the
5	legislator's point of departure; provided that, pursuant to
6	policies adopted by the New Mexico legislative council, per
7	diem under this paragraph shall be paid only if the
8	legislator is not entitled to per diem for travel time as
9	provided in Paragraph (1) of this subsection.
10	C. Reimbursement for out-of-state travel on
11	committee business shall be as follows:
12	(1) the cost of the tickets on public
13	transportation by the shortest, most direct route;
14	(2) the cost of parking;
15	(3) mileage at the same rates established
16	for in-state travel if automobiles or private airplanes are
17	used, based on official mileage by the shortest, most direct
18	route; provided that in no event shall the mileage
19	reimbursement for out-of-state travel exceed the dollar
20	amount that would be due if the member had used first class
21	public air transportation by the shortest, most direct route;
