An appeal shall stay all proceedings 21 in furtherance of the action appealed unless the officer, 22 commission or committee from whom the appeal is taken 23 certifies that by reason of facts stated in the certificate, 24 a stay would cause imminent peril of life or property. Upon 25 certification, the proceedings shall not be stayed except by

C. When an appeal alleges that there is error in
any order, requirement, decision or determination by an
administrative official, commission or committee in the
enforcement of Sections 3-21-1 through 3-21-14 NMSA 1978 or
any ordinance, resolution, rule or regulation adopted
pursuant to these sections, the zoning authority by a
majority vote of all its members may:

(1) authorize, in appropriate cases and subject to appropriate conditions and safeguards, variances or special exceptions from the terms of the zoning ordinance or resolution:

15 (a) that are not contrary 16 to the public interest;

(b) where, owing to special conditions,
a literal enforcement of the zoning ordinance will result in
unnecessary hardship;

20 (c) so that the spirit of the zoning 21 ordinance is observed and substantial justice done; and 22 (d) so that the goals and policies of 23 the comprehensive plan are implemented; or 24 (2) in conformity with Sections 3-21-1 25 through 3-21-14 NMSA 1978:
