DECLARING JANUARY 24, 2008 "SCHOOLS ON THE RISE DAY" AT THE SENATE.

independent school district; Booker T. Washington elementary
in the Hobbs municipal school district; Sunset elementary and
University high school in the Roswell independent school
district; and Arrey elementary in the Truth or Consequences
municipal school district;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that January 24, 2008 be declared "Schools on the Rise Day" at the senate to honor and recognize those ten schools; and
