WHEREAS, science-based research has shown that a young person who is matched with a big brother or big sister volunteer is:

5 A. forty-six percent less likely to start using
6 illegal drugs;

B. twenty-seven percent less likely to start drinking;

9 C. fifty-two percent less likely to skip a day of10 school;

11 D. thirty-seven percent less likely to skip a 12 class; and
