11	REQUESTING THE NEW MEXICO LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO ASSIGN THE
12	APPROPRIATE INTERIM COMMITTEE TO REVIEW THE IMPLICATIONS OF
13	CAPPING FOR PROPERTY TAX PURPOSES THE ASSESSED VALUATION OF
14	UNIMPROVED PROPERTY.
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16	WHEREAS, homeowners' property tax bills have been
17	relatively stable over the last several years as increases in
18	assessed valuation for property tax purposes have been capped
19	at three percent a year; and
20	WHEREAS, the legislature properly acted to cap increases
21	in assessed valuation to mitigate against the shocking effects
22	of "tax lightning", which resulted as the real estate market
23	drove up the potential, but unrealized, gains in property
24	values; and
25	WHEREAS, capping increases in the assessed valuation of
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residential property also had the effect of shifting more of the property tax burden to unimproved property, the owners of which do not enjoy a cap on increases in assessed valuation; and

WHEREAS, owners of unimproved property face many of the same financial challenges as homeowners who previously faced sharp and sudden increases in their property tax bills;

8 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF 9 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico 10 legislative council be requested to assign the appropriate 11 interim committee to review the policies and implications 12 associated with similarly capping increases in the assessed 13 valuation of vacant property, and then report its findings and 14 recommendations, if any, to the first session of the forty-15 ninth legislature; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the co-chairs of the New Mexico legislative council.

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
