AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL OUTLAY; LIMITING CERTAIN GENERAL FUND APPROPRIATIONS AND REVERTING BALANCES; CHANGING CERTAIN SEVERANCE TAX BOND AUTHORIZATIONS AND APPROPRIATIONS OF PROCEEDS; PROVIDING FOR REVERSION OF CERTAIN BALANCES; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. GENERAL FUND BALANCES REVERTED .-- The following appropriations from the general fund shall not be expended, and the unexpended balances up to the amount specified shall revert to the general fund:

Section 2. SEVERANCE TAX BONDS--CHANGING PURPOSES-CHANGING AUTHORIZATIONS AND PROVIDING FOR EXPENDITURES-PROVIDING FOR REVERSION TO THE SEVERANCE TAX BONDING FUND OF
ANY BALANCES NOT APPROPRIATED.--

A. The proceeds from the severance tax bonds for the capital projects specified in this subsection shall not be expended for their original purposes, but may be expended by the specified state agencies as provided in Subsection B of this section:

- The state board of finance shall determine which proceeds of the bonds issued for projects specified in Subsection A of this section shall be allocated to which projects specified in Subsection B of this section.
- The agencies specified in Subsection B of this section shall certify that projects can be begun and completed as provided in Laws 2008, Chapter 92, Section 1. authorizations for projects in Subsection B of this section not certified within two years are void. The unexpended balance of appropriations for projects in Subsection B shall revert at the end of fiscal year 2013 or upon completion of the project, whichever is earlier.

for capital outlay projects specified in Subsection A of this section that are not appropriated pursuant to Subsection B of this section shall revert to the severance tax bonding fund on the effective date of this act.

Section 3. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

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
