AN ACT

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

Section 1. A new section of the Criminal Code is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] INTIMIDATION OF A JUDGE--RETALIATION.--

- A. Intimidation of a judge consists of intentionally engaging in conduct that places a judge in reasonable apprehension of physical harm with the intent to influence the judge's exercise of the judge's official authority.
- B. Retaliation against a judge consists of intentionally causing bodily injury to or damage to the property of a judge or other person with the intent to .176678.4
