(3) holds a valid driver's license;

(4) has not been convicted of or pled guilty to or entered a plea of nolo contendere to any felony charge or, within the three-year period immediately preceding [his] <u>the</u> application, to any violation of any federal or state law or local ordinance relating to aggravated assault, theft, driving while intoxicated, controlled substances, <u>domestic</u> <u>violence, including violations described in the Crimes Against</u> <u>Household Members Act</u>, or other crime involving moral turpitude and has not been released or discharged under dishonorable conditions from any of the armed forces of the United States;

(5) after examination by a licensed physician, is free of any physical condition that might adversely affect [his] the applicant's performance as a police officer or prohibit [him] the applicant from successfully completing a prescribed basic law enforcement training required by the Law Enforcement Training Act;

(6) after examination by a certified psychologist, is free of any emotional or mental condition that might adversely affect [his] performance as a police officer or prohibit [him] the applicant from successfully completing a prescribed basic law enforcement training required by the Law Enforcement Training Act;
