18	is a crime victim to attend any judicial proceeding that
19	relates to the crime allegedly committed.
20	B. An employer may require that a request for leave
21	pursuant to this section be supported by satisfactory evidence,
22	and the employee shall provide, in a timely manner,
23	satisfactory evidence to the employer.
