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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	Section 1. A new section of the Public School Code is
17	enacted to read:
18	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
19	"School Athletics Equity Act"."
20	Section 2. A new section of the Public School Code is
21	enacted to read:
22	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] APPLICABILITYNONDISCRIMINATIONThe
23	School Athletics Equity Act applies to each public school that
24	has an athletics program for grades seven through twelve. Each
25	public school shall operate its program in a manner that does

A new section of the Public School Code is 4 enacted to read: 5 "[NEW MATERIAL] DATA REPORTING.--The department shall 6 collect annual data from public schools on their athletics 7 programs. Each public school shall collect and submit the 8 prior-year data required in this section in a format required 9 by the department. The data submitted shall include: 10 Α. by August 31, 2010, the following information 11 pertaining to enrollment: 12 the total enrollment in each public school (1) 13 as an average of enrollment at the eightieth and one hundred 14 twentieth days of the school year; 15 (2) student enrollment by gender; 16 total number of students participating in (3) 17 athletics; 18 athletics participation by gender; and (4) 19 the number of boys' teams and girls' teams (5) 20 by sport and by competition level; 21 by August 31, 2010, the following information Β. 22 pertaining to athletic directors, coaches and other school 23 personnel: 24 the name and gender of each public (1) 25 school's athletic director; .178081.2 - 2 -

2	team personnel, with their gender, job title and employment
3	status, such as full-time, part-time, contract or seasonal,

5	(3) the coach-to-athlete and staff-to-athlete

8	coaching paid to coaches of boys' teams and to coaches of
9	girls' teams for each public school;
10	C. by August 31, 2011, an accounting of the funding
11	sources that are used to support the school's athletics
12	programs and to which teams those funds are allocated; funding
13	sources include state funding, federal funding, fundraising or
14	booster clubs, game and concession receipts, gate receipts,
15	cash or in-kind donations, grants and any other source;
16	D. by August 31, 2011, the following information
17	regarding expenses, including:
18	(1) any capital outlay expenditures for each
19	public school's athletics programs;
20	(2) the expenditures for each public school's
21	athletics programs; and
22	(3) the expenditures for individual teams,
23	including travel expenses such as transportation, meal
24	allowances and overnight accommodations; equipment; uniforms;
25	facilities; facilities improvements; publicity expenses;
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1 awards; banquets; insurance; and any other expenses incurred by 2 each team: and 3 Ε. by August 31, 2011, a statement of benefits and 4 services to each team, including: 5 replacement schedules for equipment, (1)6 uniforms and supplies; 7 practice and game schedules; (2) 8 access to locker rooms, weight rooms and (3) 9 practice, competitive and training facilities; and 10 (4) assistance in obtaining scholarships." 11 Section 4. A new section of the Public School Code is 12 enacted to read: 13 "[NEW MATERIAL] DISCLOSURE TO STUDENTS AND PUBLIC .--14 Each public school shall make its data available Α. 15 to the public, including all materials relied upon to compile 16 the data. Each public school shall inform all students at the 17 public school of their right to review the data. 18 The department shall publish the following Β. 19 information: 20 each public school's data; and (1) 21 a list of public schools that did not (2) 22 submit fully completed data. 23 Each public school shall maintain its data and C. 24 all materials relied upon to complete the data for at least 25 three years. Each public school shall publish its data in a .178081.2 - 4 -

1 newspaper of general circulation in the state or make the data
2 available on a publicly accessible web site."

3 Section 5. A new section of the Public School Code is
4 enacted to read:

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"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] ASSURANCE OF COMPLIANCE.--

A. Each public school shall submit an assurance of compliance with Title 9 to its local school board or governing body and provide a copy to the department no later than August 31 of each year. The assurance shall be signed by the public school's principal or Title 9 coordinator. The department shall publish, in a newspaper of general circulation in the state or on a publicly accessible web site, a list of public schools that fail to submit the assurance of compliance with Title 9.

B. As used in this section, "Title 9" means federal Public Law 92-318, Title 9, of the Education Amendments of 1972, which is codified at 20 U.S.C. 1681, et seq., and the regulations promulgated pursuant to that act."

Section 6. A new section of the Public School Code is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] REPORT TO GOVERNOR AND LEGISLATURE.--Beginning December 1, 2010, the department shall submit annually a report on the School Athletics Equity Act to the governor and the legislature, including a summary of the data received from the public schools. The report shall include .178081.2

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recommendations on how to increase gender equity in athletics in public schools. The department shall post the report on its web site." - 6 -[bracketed material] = delete .178081.2
