18	recognition of Mr. Martinez's lifelong dedication to bilingual

25	adopted by law. The cultural affairs department may conduct a		
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		1	bilingual poem competition to select a new poem for
		2	consideration by the legislature in 2013 or later, to be
		3	designated as the state bilingual poem.
		4	Section 3. STATE BILINGUAL POEM FOR EDUCATION AND
		5	TOURISMThe cultural affairs department, the public education
		6	department and the tourism department shall use the state
		7	bilingual poem to advance bilingual education in the state and
		8	to further the goals of each department.
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
