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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	Section 1. A new section of Chapter 12 NMSA 1978 is
19	enacted to read:
20	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL]</u> SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
21	"Emergency Communications Interoperability Act"."
22	Section 2. A new section of Chapter 12 NMSA 1978 is
23	enacted to read:

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1 Α. "department" means the homeland security and 2 emergency management department; "first responder" means a public safety employee 3 Β. 4 or volunteer whose duties include responding rapidly to an 5 emergency, including but not limited to: a law enforcement officer; 6 (1) 7 (2) a firefighter or certified volunteer 8 firefighter; and 9 (3) an emergency medical services provider; 10 C. "infrastructure equipment" means the underlying 11 fixed equipment required to establish interoperable 12 communications between radio systems used by local, state, 13 tribal and federal agencies and first responders; and 14 D. "interoperability" means coordination of 15 critical information communication systems or networks, 16 including radio and emergency coordination information 17 equipment, that are consistently operable with all relevant 18 local, state, tribal and federal agencies and first 19 responders." 20 Section 3. A new section of Chapter 12 NMSA 1978 is 21 enacted to read: 22 "[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] INTEROPERABILITY PLANNING COMMISSION--23 CREATED. --24 The "interoperability planning commission" is Α. 25 created and administratively attached to the department. .174057.4SA

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1 Β. The interoperability planning commission is a 2 permanent advisory commission created to advise and support the department on emergency response and homeland security 3 4 activities relating to interoperability, the obtaining of 5 funding and the use of available funding. 6 C. The commission consists of twelve members, 7 including: 8 the lieutenant governor; (1) 9 (2) the homeland security advisor; 10 (3) the secretary of information technology or 11 the secretary's designee; 12 the adjutant general or a representative (4) 13 from the department of military affairs; 14 the secretary of energy, minerals and (5) 15 natural resources or the secretary's designee; 16 the state fire marshal or the fire (6) 17 marshal's designee; 18 (7) the secretary of Indian affairs or the 19 secretary's designee; 20 the secretary of transportation or the (8) 21 secretary's designee; 22 (9) the secretary of health or the secretary's 23 designee; 24 (10) the secretary of public safety or the 25 secretary's designee; .174057.4SA - 3 -

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(11) the executive director of the New Mexico 1 2 municipal league or the executive director's designee; and 3 (12) the executive director of the New Mexico 4 association of counties or the executive director's designee. 5 The commission shall appoint a chair and vice D. chair from among its members. The commission shall meet at the 6 7 call of the chair but no less than two times each year. 8 Members of the commission, or their designees, Ε. 9 who are not supported by public money may be reimbursed for per 10 diem and mileage pursuant to the Per Diem and Mileage Act, but 11 shall not receive any other compensation, perquisite or 12 allowance." 13 Section 4. A new section of Chapter 12 NMSA 1978 is 14 enacted to read: 15 "[NEW MATERIAL] INTEROPERABILITY PLANNING COMMISSION--16 DUTIES.--The interoperability planning commission shall advise 17 the department on: 18 Α. the development and coordination of a statewide 19 interoperable emergency communications plan in compliance with 20 national incident management system guidelines, including an 21 integrated public safety radio communications system and other 22 coordinated critical information systems, to achieve 23 interoperability within and between local, state, tribal and 24 federal agencies and first responders; 25 Β. implementation of the interoperable emergency .174057.4SA - 4 -

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1 communications plan by state and local agencies and shall 2 provide specific directions for methods by which agencies shall 3 implement those strategies; 4 C. priorities relating to the interoperable 5 emergency communications plan; and other matters relating to planning, development, 6 D. 7 coordination, promotion and implementation of the interoperable 8 emergency communications plan." 9 Section 5. A new section of Chapter 12 NMSA 1978 is 10 enacted to read: "[NEW MATERIAL] INTEROPERABILITY--DEPARTMENT.--The 11 12 department shall: 13 establish, implement and administer a statewide Α. 14 interoperable emergency communications plan and standards for 15 a statewide integrated public safety radio communications 16 system; 17 train representatives of entities in the state B. 18 that are involved in emergency response and homeland security 19 activities with respect to interoperability; 20 require that all radio communications at C. 21 emergency incidents adhere to the national incident management 22 system guidelines established by the federal department of 23 homeland security and statewide integrated public safety radio 24 communications standards; 25 D. use appropriated money, including money from .174057.4SA

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1	relevant federal homeland security grants, for the purposes of
2	designing and promulgating systems compliant with the standards
3	established under Subsection A of this section and to enable
4	the implementation and maintenance of a statewide interoperable
5	public safety radio communications system; and
6	E. report annually to the appropriate interim
7	legislative committee."
8	Section 6. A new section of Chapter 12 NMSA 1978 is
9	enacted to read:
10	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] INTEROPERABILITYAGENCY COMPLIANCEA11
11	state and local agency budgets and plans to purchase
12	infrastructure equipment shall conform to the interoperability
13	standards developed by the department."
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
