17	Section 1. LOCAL AUTHORIZATION FOR CHARITABLE
18	SOLICITATION IN ROADWAYS
19	A. A charitable organization that is registered
20	with the attorney general pursuant to the Charitable
21	Solicitations Act may engage in a solicitation for charitable
22	purposes that involves persons standing in a public roadway, on
23	the shoulder of a public roadway or on a median between public
24	roadways soliciting contributions from passing motorists if the
25	following requirements are met:

1 all persons engaged in the solicitation (1) 2 are law enforcement personnel, firefighters or other persons 3 employed to protect public safety and are soliciting solely in 4 an area that is within the service area of the agencies for 5 which they work; and 6 (2)the charitable organization files an 7 application with the municipality or county having jurisdiction 8 over the location where the solicitation is to occur. The 9 application shall be filed no later than ten business days 10 before the date the solicitation is to begin and shall include 11 the following: 12 the date and time the solicitation (a) 13 is to occur; 14 (b) the location where the solicitation 15 is to occur; 16 the number of persons to be involved (c) 17 in the solicitation; 18 (d) the manner and conditions under 19 which the solicitation is to occur; and 20 (e) proof of a valid liability insurance 21 policy in the amount of at least one million dollars 22 (\$1,000,000) insuring the charitable organization, the agency 23 for which the persons making the solicitation work and the 24 municipality or county to which the application is made against 25 bodily injury and property damage arising out of or in .175383.1 - 2 -

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1 connection with the solicitation.

B. The municipality or county shall approve a
complete application within five business days of the filing
date of the application but may impose reasonable conditions in
writing that are consistent with this section and that are
based on articulated public safety concerns.

C. An agency employing persons engaged in
solicitations pursuant to this section and a municipality or
county approving an application pursuant to this section do not
waive or limit immunity from liability provided by another
provision of law.

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
