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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	Section 1. A new section of the Campaign Reporting Act is
19	enacted to read:
20	"[ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] BUSINESS ENTITIESCONTRIBUTIONS FOR
21	CANDIDATES AND CERTAIN POLITICAL COMMITTEES PROHIBITED
22	A. A business entity shall not make a contribution
23	to or solicit a contribution on behalf of:
24	(1) a candidate for nomination or election to
25	a state office or a campaign committee established by the
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1 candidate; or

17	"[ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] STATE CONTRACTORSCONTRIBUTIONS FOR
18	CANDIDATES AND CERTAIN POLITICAL COMMITTEES PROHIBITED
19	A. A state contractor or a principal of a state
20	contractor shall not make a contribution to or solicit
21	contributions on behalf of:
22	(1) a candidate for nomination or election to
23	a state office or a campaign committee established by the
24	candidate; or
25	(2) a political committee:
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1 (a) established by a public officer or 2 an agent of the public officer or in consultation with or at 3 the request or suggestion of the public officer or an agent of 4 the public officer; or 5 (b) controlled by a public officer or an agent of the public officer to aid or promote the nomination or 6 7 election of any candidate or candidates to a state office. 8 A candidate or political committee described in Β. 9 Subsection A of this section shall not accept or solicit a 10 contribution prohibited by that subsection. 11 C. The provisions of this section shall not 12 restrict a principal of a state contractor from establishing a 13 campaign committee for the principal's own campaign or from 14 soliciting contributions from persons not prohibited from 15 making contributions by this section." 16 Section 4. Section 1-19-26 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1979, 17 Chapter 360, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read: 18 "1-19-26. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Campaign Reporting 19 Act: 20 "advertising campaign" means an advertisement or Α. 21 series of advertisements used for a political purpose and 22 disseminated to the public either in print, by radio or 23 television broadcast or by any other electronic means, 24 including telephonic communications, and may include direct or 25 bulk mailings of printed materials;

6 institution located in New Mexico;

D. "business entity" includes, whether organized
inside or outside of this state, a sole proprietorship,
partnership, joint venture, limited liability company,
corporation and any other association, organization or entity
that is engaged in the operation of a business or profit-making
activity;

[<del>D.</del>] <u>E.</u> "campaign committee" means two or more persons authorized by a candidate to raise, collect or expend contributions on the candidate's behalf for the purpose of electing [him] <u>the candidate</u> to office;

 $[\underline{E}, \underline{F}]$  <u>F</u>. "candidate" means an individual who seeks or considers an office in an election covered by the Campaign Reporting Act, including a public official, who either has filed a declaration of candidacy or nominating petition or:

(1) for a nonstatewide office, has received contributions or made expenditures of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more or authorized another person or campaign committee to receive contributions or make expenditures of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or more for the purpose of seeking .176982.3GR

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1 election to the office; or

2 (2) for a statewide office, has received 3 contributions or made expenditures of two thousand five hundred 4 dollars (\$2,500) or more or authorized another person or 5 campaign committee to receive contributions or make 6 expenditures of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) or 7 more for the purpose of seeking election to the office or for 8 candidacy exploration purposes in the years prior to the year 9 of the election;

[F-] <u>G.</u> "contribution" means a gift, subscription, loan, advance or deposit of money or other thing of value, including the estimated value of an in-kind contribution, that is made or received for a political purpose, including payment of a debt incurred in an election campaign, but does not include the value of services provided without compensation or unreimbursed travel or other personal expenses of individuals who volunteer a portion or all of their time on behalf of a candidate or political committee, nor does it include the administrative or solicitation expenses of a political committee that are paid by an organization that sponsors the committee;

[G.] <u>H.</u> "deliver" or "delivery" means to deliver by certified or registered mail, telecopier, electronic transmission or facsimile or by personal service;

[H.] <u>I.</u> "election" means any primary, general or .176982.3GR

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statewide special election in New Mexico and includes county and judicial retention elections but excludes municipal, school board and special district elections;

[<del>I.</del>] <u>J.</u> "election year" means an even-numbered year in which an election covered by the Campaign Reporting Act is held;

[J.] K. "expenditure" means a payment, transfer or 7 8 distribution or obligation or promise to pay, transfer or 9 distribute any money or other thing of value for a political 10 purpose, including payment of a debt incurred in an election 11 campaign or pre-primary convention, but does not include the 12 administrative or solicitation expenses of a political 13 committee that are paid by an organization that sponsors the 14 committee;

[K.] L. "person" means an individual or entity;

[L.] M. "political committee" means two or more persons, other than members of a candidate's immediate family or campaign committee or a husband and wife who make a contribution out of a joint account, who are selected, appointed, chosen, associated, organized or operated primarily for a political purpose; and "political committee" includes:

(1) political action committees or similar organizations composed of employees or members of any corporation, labor organization, trade or professional association or any other similar group that raises, collects, .176982.3GR

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1 expends or contributes money or any other thing of value for a political purpose; 2 3 a single individual [who by his] whose (2) 4 actions [<del>represents</del>] represent that [<del>he</del>] the individual is a 5 political committee; and 6 (3) a person or an organization of two or more 7 persons that within one calendar year expends funds in excess 8 of five hundred dollars (\$500) to conduct an advertising 9 campaign for a political purpose; 10 [M.] N. "political purpose" means influencing or 11 attempting to influence an election or pre-primary convention, 12 including a constitutional amendment or other question 13 submitted to the voters: 14 [N.] O. "prescribed form" means a form or 15 electronic format prepared and prescribed by the secretary of 16 state; 17 P. "principal of a state contractor" means, in 18 addition to the state contractor itself: 19 (1) a person who is a member of the board of 20 directors of, or has an ownership interest in, a state 21 contractor, except for an individual who owns less than five 22 percent of the shares of that state contractor that is a 23 publicly traded corporation; 24 (2) a person who is employed by a state 25 contractor that is a business entity, as president, treasurer .176982.3GR

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1 or executive or senior vice president; 2 (3) a person who is the chief executive 3 officer of a state contractor; 4 (4) an employee of any state contractor who 5 has managerial or discretionary responsibilities with respect 6 to a state contract; 7 (5) the spouse or a dependent child of a person described in Paragraphs (1) through (4) of this 8 9 subsection; or (6) a political committee established by or on 10 11 behalf of a person described in this subsection; 12 [0.] Q. "proper filing officer" means [either] the 13 secretary of state [or the county clerk] as provided in Section 14 1-19-27 NMSA 1978; 15 [P.] R. "public officer" or "public official" means 16 a person elected to an office in an election covered by the 17 Campaign Reporting Act or a person appointed to an office that 18 is subject to an election covered by that act; 19 [Q.] S. "reporting individual" means every public 20 official, candidate or treasurer of a campaign committee and 21 every treasurer of a political committee; [and] 22 T. "state agency" means an office, department, 23 board, council, commission, institution or other agency in the 24 executive, legislative or judicial branch of state government 25 or an institution or instrumentality of the state; .176982.3GR - 9 -

2	with the state or any state agency having a value of twenty
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	thousand dollars (\$20,000) or more, or a combination or series
4	of such agreements or contracts having a value of twenty
5	thousand dollars (\$20,000) or more in a fiscal year, for:
6	(1) the rendition of services, including
7	professional services and financial services;
8	(2) the furnishing of any material, supplies
9	<u>or equipment;</u>
10	(3) the construction, alteration or repair of
11	any public building or public work;
12	(4) the acquisition, sale or lease of any land
13	<u>or building;</u>
14	(5) a licensing arrangement;
15	<u>(6) a grant, loan or loan guarantee; or</u>
16	(7) the purchase or sale of financial
17	securities or instruments or investment of public money;

19	business entity or nonprofit organization, that enters into a
20	state contract, which shall be deemed to be a state contractor
21	until the termination of the contract. "State contractor" does
22	not include a municipality or any other political subdivision
23	of the state or an employee of a state agency, whether full- or
24	part-time, in that person's capacity as an employee of the
25	state; and
