A person may be excused from jury service at 21 the discretion of the judge or the judge's designee, with or 22 without the person's personal attendance upon the court, if: 23 jury service would cause undue or 24 (1)extreme physical or financial hardship to the prospective 25

(2) the person has an emergency that rendersthe person unable to perform jury service; or

(3) the person presents other satisfactory evidence to the judge or the judge's designee.

D. A person requesting an exemption or an excuse
from jury service shall take all necessary action to obtain a
ruling on the request no later than the date on which the
person is scheduled to appear for jury duty.

E. The judge, in the judge's discretion, upon granting any excuse, may disallow the fees and mileage of the person excused.

F. The service upon a jury of a person disqualified shall, of itself, not vitiate any indictment found or any verdict rendered by that jury, unless actual injury to the person complaining of the injury is shown.

18 G. As used in this section and Section 38-5-1 NMSA
19 1978, "undue or extreme physical or financial hardship":

20 (1) means circumstances in which a person
21 would:

(a) be required to abandon another person under the person's care or supervision due to the extreme difficulty of obtaining an appropriate substitute caregiver during the period of jury service;
