The annual educator accountability report format shall be clear, concise and understandable to the 16 legislature and the general public. All annual program and 17 statewide accountability reports shall ensure that the 18 privacy of individual students is protected. 19 20 C. In addition to the specifications in 17 Subsections C and D of this section, the annual educator 18 accountability report shall also include itemized information 19 20 on program revenues and expenditures, including staff salaries and benefits and the operational cost per credit 21 hour. 22 F.
