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C. Except as provided in Subsections E and F of this section, all state vehicles shall be marked as state vehicles. Each side of the vehicle shall be marked, in letters not less than two inches in height, with the following designation of ownership: "State of New Mexico,..... Department" or "State of New Mexico Department of ......" and naming the department using the vehicle.

D. Except as provided in Subsections E and F of this section, all state vehicles shall have specially designed government registration plates.

E. Only state vehicles used for legitimate undercover law enforcement purposes are exempt from the requirements of Subsections C and D of this section. All other state vehicles owned or in the custody of state agencies that have law enforcement functions shall be marked and have state government registration plates.

F. A state agency may seek custody of state
vehicles as an exception to Subsection B of this section or
an exemption to the provisions of Subsection C of this
section by making a written request to the director,
specifying the reasons for the proposed custody or exemption.
The director may approve the custody or exemption, in
writing, indicating the duration and any conditions of the SB 232

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custody or exemption.

The division shall adopt rules permitting 3 individuals enrolled in the state's adaptive driving program to use special-use state vehicles for evaluation and training 4 5 purposes in that program." E. "maintenance" does not include:

(1) conduct involved in the issuance of a permit, driver's license or other official authorization to use the roads or highways of the state in a particular manner; or

(2) an activity or event relating to a public building or public housing project that was not foreseeable;

F. "public employee" means an officer, employee or 8 servant of a governmental entity, excluding independent 9 10 contractors except for individuals defined in Paragraphs (7), 11 (8), (10), (14) and (17) of this subsection, or of a corporation organized pursuant to the Educational Assistance 12 Act, the Small Business Investment Act or the Mortgage 13 Finance Authority Act or a licensed health care provider, who 14 15 has no medical liability insurance, providing voluntary services as defined in Paragraph (16) of this subsection and 16 including: 17

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(1) elected or appointed officials;

(2) law enforcement officers;

20 (3) persons acting on behalf or in service 21 of a governmental entity in any official capacity, whether 22 with or without compensation;

(4) licensed foster parents providing care
for children in the custody of the human services department,
corrections department or department of health, but not SB

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1 including foster parents certified by a licensed child 2 placement agency; 3 (5) members of state or local selection panels established pursuant to the Adult Community 4 5 Corrections Act; (6) members of state or local selection 6 panels established pursuant to the Juvenile Community 7 Corrections Act; 8 licensed medical, psychological or 9 (7) dental arts practitioners providing services to the 10 corrections department pursuant to contract; 11 (8) members of the board of directors of the 12 New Mexico medical insurance pool; 13 (9) individuals who are members of medical 14 15 review boards, committees or panels established by the educational retirement board or the retirement board of the 16 public employees retirement association; 17 licensed medical, psychological or 18 (10)dental arts practitioners providing services to the children, 19 20 youth and families department pursuant to contract; members of the board of directors of (11)21 the New Mexico educational assistance foundation; 22 (12)members of the board of directors of 23 the New Mexico student loan guarantee corporation; 24 (13) members of the New Mexico mortgage 25 SB 232 Page 5 1 finance authority;

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(14) volunteers, employees and board members of court-appointed special advocate programs;

(15) members of the board of directors of the small business investment corporation;

6 (16) health care providers licensed in New 7 Mexico who render voluntary health care services without compensation in accordance with rules promulgated by the 8 secretary of health. The rules shall include requirements 9 for the types of locations at which the services are 10 rendered, the allowed scope of practice and measures to 11 ensure quality of care; and 12

(17) an individual while participating in 13 the state's adaptive driving program and only while using a 14 15 special-use state vehicle for evaluation and training 16 purposes in that program;

"scope of duty" means performing any duties G. that a public employee is requested, required or authorized 18 to perform by the governmental entity, regardless of the time 20 and place of performance; and
