7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
8	Section 1. Section 29-2-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1941,
9	Chapter 147, Section 6, as amended) is amended to read:
10	"29-2-6. QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS
11	A. Members of the New Mexico state police, except
12	the chief, shall:
13	(1) at the time of their appointment, be
14	citizens of the United States;
15	(2) at the time of their appointment, have
16	reached twenty-one years of age;
17	(3) except as otherwise provided in
18	Subsection B of this section, at the time of their
19	appointment, have completed at least sixty hours of college
20	credit;
21	(4) be of good moral character and not have
22	been convicted of a felony or infamous crime in the courts of
23	this state or other state or any country or in the federal
24	courts; and
25	(5) pass a physical examination the New

Mexico state police may require.

- B. Notwithstanding the requirement of Paragraph (3) of Subsection A of this section, the chief may appoint a member of the New Mexico state police who has at least thirty hours of college credit, and the chief shall determine an appropriate time period after appointment for the member to complete the additional thirty hours of college credit required.
