A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE NEW MEXICO HEALTH POLICY COMMISSION TO CONVENE

A MEETING OF PUBLIC ENTITIES ENGAGED IN THE ADMINISTRATION,

DELIVERY AND PAYMENT OF HEALTH CARE SERVICES IN NEW MEXICO TO

ELICIT THEIR COOPERATION IN IDENTIFYING AREAS OF COMMON

INTEREST AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR CONSOLIDATION.

WHEREAS, the New Mexico health policy commission is statutorily charged with developing a plan for and monitoring the implementation of the state's health policy, including obtaining and evaluating information relating to access to health care services in the public and private sector; and

WHEREAS, the Health Care Purchasing Act requires consolidated purchasing of publicly financed health insurance benefits for public employees, public school employees and the retirees of public employment and public schools; and

WHEREAS, the New Mexico health insurance alliance is a nonprofit, public corporation created for the purpose of increasing access to health insurance in the state, and all health insurance companies authorized to transact health insurance business in the state are required to be members of the alliance; and

WHEREAS, the Medical Insurance Pool Act serves to provide access to health insurance for all New Mexicans who are denied adequate health insurance and are considered

uninsurable, and all health insurance companies authorized to transact health insurance business in the state are required to be members of the New Mexico medical insurance pool; and

WHEREAS, the state coverage insurance program is a public-private venture designed to extend health insurance coverage to the working poor who are at or below two hundred percent of the federal poverty level; and

WHEREAS, New Mexico funds two premium assistance programs designed to subsidize the cost of insurance coverage for children and pregnant women; and

WHEREAS, these and other plans and programs exist to address the overall health care needs of the residents of New Mexico; and

WHEREAS, although the specific purposes of each plan and program may differ, and the populations served by each plan and program may have unique needs, there are undoubtedly many elements that are similar among the plans and programs that would benefit from a more consolidated and efficient approach to administration; and

WHEREAS, ideas regarding consolidation of public health care programs and plans have been considered in numerous previous legislative proposals to reform the system of health care in New Mexico and have generally been opposed by the public entities that would be affected by such consolidation; and

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WHEREAS, the current organization of publicly funded plans and programs results in silos of administration, delivery and payment for health care services; and

WHEREAS, an emphasis on cooperation and collaboration can lead to creative solutions that will benefit all New Mexicans;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the New Mexico health policy commission be requested to convene a meeting of public entities engaged in the administration, delivery and payment of health care services to elicit their cooperation in identifying areas of common interest and opportunities for consolidation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that specific recommendations for implementing cooperative and collaborative efforts be developed and reported to the interim legislative health and human services committee during its November meeting; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the New Mexico health policy commission, the retiree health care authority, the risk management division of the general services department, the Albuquerque public schools, the public school insurance authority, the medical assistance division of the human services department, the New Mexico health insurance alliance and the New Mexico medical insurance pool.
