A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE INSTITUTE OF PUBLIC LAW AT THE UNIVERSITY OF
NEW MEXICO SCHOOL OF LAW TO DESIGN THE FORMAT OF AND CONDUCT
ONE OR MORE PUBLIC MEETINGS AND EMPLOY OTHER APPROPRIATE
METHODS TO OBTAIN PUBLIC COMMENT ON THE PROCEDURES AND
PROCESSES FOR ADJUDICATING WATER RIGHTS.

WHEREAS, the water and natural resources committee chairs appointed a water adjudications subcommittee, which met for two interims to review water adjudications issues; and

WHEREAS, stakeholders have expressed concerns about any proposed reform of existing adjudication statutes; and

WHEREAS, delays in completion of judicial review of title to water rights raises doubts about fair payment and transaction of water rights exchange or transfers;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the institute of public law at the university of New Mexico school of law be requested to design the format of and conduct one or more public meetings and employ other appropriate methods to obtain public comment on the procedures and processes for adjudicating water rights, the purpose of which shall be to:

A. provide the public with an understanding of issues associated with the adjudication of water rights and

the possibilities for reforming those procedures that were identified during the study of the water rights adjudication processes of other states conducted by the administrative office of the courts and the office of the state engineer pursuant to the 2008 memorandum of understanding between those two agencies;

B. obtain public feedback and analysis of alternative reform proposals; and

C. identify public concerns and points of view related to alternative adjudication reform proposals; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the public meetings shall include persons who have participated actively in water rights adjudications, such as water rights claimants and representatives of conservancy and irrigation districts and acequias; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that professional engineers, attorneys and representatives of all affected agencies of state, federal and tribal or pueblo governments be encouraged to attend and to participate actively in these processes; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the institute of public law be requested to prepare and submit a written report on or before August 1, 2009 that presents as balanced and objective a view as possible of the various concerns and alternative perspectives expressed by the public through this process to the legislative finance committee and the appropriate interim

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committee of the legislature, as well as to the administrative $% \left(\frac{1}{2}\right) =\frac{1}{2}\left(\frac{1}{2}\right) $
