A JOINT MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT TO SUPPORT THE
PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT OF HEALTH COMMONS MODELS OF SERVICE
DELIVERY IN HIDALGO COUNTY AND BERNALILLO COUNTY AND TO
COLLABORATE WITH EXISTING HEALTH COMMONS IN THOSE COUNTIES TO
DESIGN A FINANCING SYSTEM TO COVER AND SUPPORT THE HEALTH
COMMONS MODEL OF CARE.

WHEREAS, the current system of health care delivery in

New Mexico and the nation is fragmented, expensive and

unavailable to nearly four hundred thousand New Mexicans; and

WHEREAS, the current system of health care delivery financing is focused on providing high-volume, intensive services with little attention to improving individual or community health; and

WHEREAS, New Mexico and its residents would benefit from a model of health care delivery that provides affordable, coordinated services focused on personal, family and community health needs; and

WHEREAS, a health commons is a community-driven, seamless system of social, behavioral and medical services organized within a single clinical center, linked with a network of community-based programs; and

WHEREAS, a health commons typically provides "one-stop shopping" beyond traditional medical services; and

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WHEREAS, the health commons model of service delivery provides a medical home for people served by that model; and

WHEREAS, established health commons models in New Mexico are serving rural, underserved and poor populations efficiently and effectively in Hidalgo county and in the south valley of Bernalillo county; and

WHEREAS, the university of New Mexico health sciences center supports the design and evaluation of community and health commons service models; and

WHEREAS, payment sources to reimburse health commons models of care are limited to traditional, medical interventions and do not reimburse for such valuable services as health education, community health worker services, health promotion, peer support and other wrap-around services, nor do they cover the cost of caring for the many uninsured residents who currently utilize these models of care; and

WHEREAS, despite many local collaborative partners, existing health commons models are struggling to survive; and

WHEREAS, health commons models should be replicated in other rural and underserved parts of New Mexico;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the human services department be requested to support the planning and development of health commons models of service delivery in Hidalgo county and Bernalillo county and to collaborate with existing health

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commons in those counties to design a financing system to cover and support the health commons model of care; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the human services department consider appropriate measures to include coverage of health commons models of service delivery in medicaid physical health, long-term services and behavioral health services managed care contracts; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that consideration be given to application for appropriate federal waivers to support the development of and sustainable financing for health commons models of health care delivery; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a report of the recommendations arising from this collaboration be presented to the legislative health and human services committee by November 1, 2009; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the secretary of human services, the director of Hidalgo medical services and the director of the South Valley family health commons in Bernalillo county.

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
