## SUMMARY

#### Synopsis of Bill

House Joint Memorial 83 requests that the Public Education Department collaborate with state institutions of higher learning, gifted education organizations and LESC to determine the requirements for a gifted education endorsement on teaching licenses.

## FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

None Noted

## SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The joint memorial finds that a large population of gifted students receives educational services in the state and that a need exists for teachers of gifted students to be properly trained and to receive a licensure endorsement when they properly demonstrate the competencies of such a teacher.

The joint memorial requests the collaboration between PED, LESC, higher learning institutions and gifted learning organizations to determine the competencies required for a gifted education endorsement.

HJM-83 also requests that the study include an assessment of existing materials and examinations that could be adopted as an appropriate gifted education assessment to determine if a teacher is highly qualified.
