10	A MEMORIAL
11	DECLARING MARCH 5, 2009 "ST. MICHAEL'S HIGH SCHOOL 150TH
12	ANNIVERSARY DAY" AT THE SENATE AND COMMEMORATING THE HISTORY
13	AND TRADITION OF ST. MICHAEL'S HIGH SCHOOL'S ONE HUNDRED FIFTY
14	YEARS IN THE CITY OF SANTA FE, NEW MEXICO.
15	
16	WHEREAS, in the summer of 1859, New Mexico Archbishop Lamy
17	requested that the Christian Brothers from France come to Santa
18	Fe to open a school for boys; and
19	WHEREAS, Brothers Hilarien, Gondulph, Geramius and Galmier
20	Joseph arrived in the early afternoon of October 27 and set to
21	work opening a school on Old Santa Fe trail in an adobe hut
22	next to the San Miguel mission just two weeks later; and
23	WHEREAS, the first boarding students arrived on November 9
24	and classes began on November 22, 1859; and
25	WHEREAS, eleven years later, amidst difficult financial

WHEREAS, his joy and enthusiasm inspired his co-laborers, and they began to raise money for upgrading and developing St. Michael's High School; and

WHEREAS, during his thirty-six-year tenure as director of 8 the school, new structures were erected and the school's academic reputation grew; and

10 WHEREAS, two of those structures that remain are the 11 present-day Lamy building and the present-day Lew Wallace 12 building; and

WHEREAS, in 1876, St. Michael's conferred diplomas upon its first graduates; and

WHEREAS, the territorial constitutional convention met in the Lew Wallace building to draft the constitution of New Mexico in 1910, and one-fourth of the convention delegates were alumni of St. Michael's; and

WHEREAS, in 1926, a fire destroyed the tower and upper story of the school; and

WHEREAS, the damage was so extensive and estimated repairs so costly that St. Michael's faced closure; and

WHEREAS, the school's director, Brother August, was walking downtown and contemplating the fate of the school, when he encountered Miguel Chavez, an alumnus and successful .177472.1

2 WHEREAS, Miguel Chavez, upon hearing of the school's 3 difficulties, decided to finance the rebuilding of St. 4 Michael's; and 5 WHEREAS, the St. Michael's community continued to grow 6 over the next five decades, and by the 1960s, it had outgrown 7 its location on Old Santa Fe trail; and 8 WHEREAS, St. Michael's moved to its current Siringo road 9 location in 1967; and 10 WHEREAS, in 1968, the school became coeducational after 11 the closing of Loretto academy; and 12 WHEREAS, in the 1990s, science laboratories and new 13 classrooms were added to St. Michael's and the Tipton sports 14 center was completed; and 15 WHEREAS, a new building was added in the 2000s, and 16 improvements were made to classrooms, offices and athletic 17 fields; and 18 WHEREAS, a statue of St. John Baptist de la Salle was 19 recently installed at the school's front entrance; and 20 WHEREAS, St. John Baptist de la Salle founded the 21 institute of the brothers of the Christian schools, the 22 Christian Brothers, in 1680 in Rheims, France; and 23 WHEREAS, the son of wealth and privilege, de la Salle 24 joined the priesthood and became committed to educating the 25 children of poor and working-class people; and

1 WHEREAS, over time, he trained and organized a group of 2 men to live in community and conduct the school; and 3 WHEREAS, the core principles of a Lasallian school are: faith in the presence of God; 4 Α. 5 Β. respect for all persons; 6 C. quality education; 7 D. concern for the poor and social justice; and 8 Ε. a united community where diversity is respected; 9 and 10 WHEREAS, St. Michael's high school, with a college 11 preparatory curriculum, has, as its mission, to educate every 12 student in a spirit of faith and academic excellence according to Roman Catholic principles in the Lasallian tradition of the 13 14 Christian Brothers; and 15 WHEREAS, the school's anniversary celebration begins 16 today, with the reading of this memorial; and 17 WHEREAS, April 30, 2009 will be dedicated to the founders 18 of St. Michael's high school, with Archbishop Sheehan presiding 19 over a celebration and mass and with a dinner reception to 20 follow; and 21 WHEREAS, the celebration will continue with a sports 22 achievement event that honors St. Michael's high school's 23 long-running and successful athletic program; and 24 WHEREAS, all of Santa Fe will be invited to "Community 25 Day" on September 27, 2009, celebrating St. Michael's one .177472.1

WHEREAS, an all-class reunion and gala will take place the weekend of October 9 through 11, 2009; and

WHEREAS, on Sunday, October 11, 2009, a mass at the St. Francis cathedral basilica will be held to honor the one hundred fiftieth anniversary celebration;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that March 5, 2009 be declared "St. Michael's High School 150th Anniversary Day" at the senate and that congratulations be extended to St. Michael's high school's Christian Brothers, students, alumni, staff and faculty, past and present, and that gratitude be expressed to Lasallian Brothers throughout the world for their commitment to educate all; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the Christian Brothers, the St. Michael's high school board of trustees, the archdiocese of Santa Fe, the mayor and city council of the city of Santa Fe and the county commissioners of Santa Fe.
